Dear Chair Ige and Committee Members,

Thank you for this opportunity to speak on my behalf as one of the governor's nominees for consideration and confirmation to the State Council on Mental Health.

Currently, I am serving as the Chair for the State Council on Mental Health. Before being elected Chair by the Council, I served as the Vice Chair for one year. My total time on the Council has been about two and a half years.

When a former representative from the Hawaii Island <u>Service Area Board</u> on Mental Health and Substance Abuse (SAB) could no longer serve on the State Council, I was chosen to take her place. I am currently the Vice Chair on the SAB and the membership chair. Two very busy jobs.

"Busy" also characterizes my duties on the State Council on Mental Health. There are several duties I take care of in-between meetings in addition to serving on the membership committee, the legislative committee and the by-laws ad hoc committee. I also represent the Council at certain times outside of the meetings and at functions such as workshops and conferences. As Chair, I also have a position on the Mental Health Transformation Grant.

But I must confess that I would not be doing <u>any</u> of the above if it wasn't for the very warm and loving support that I receive from the Council members. "Loving" might seem a strange word to use here, but the feeling of Aloha from the Council members is what keeps me going. Additionally, I also receive wonderful support and encouragement from the Chief of the Adult Mental Health Division, Dr. Thomas Hester.

With the help of the Council members and Dr. Hester, I have been able to broaden the scope of the council with new ideas, tasks, more advocacy for consumers, and the enrichment of the membership. For the first time in the history of the Council, we now have representation of mental health consumers and family members from all of the five major islands. We will also be welcoming our first young adult consumer representative who receives services from the Child and Adolescent Mental Health Division (CAMHD).

Even though much is involved in what I do, I have to be attentive to my own health concerns. Being able to depend on loving Council members and some special adult mental health staffers, I am able to do what needs to be done. Volunteer service with them is a gift and rewarding.
