It is with pleasure that the Department of Land and Natural Resources (Department) recommends Senate confirmation of the appointment of William Ryan Chapman to the Hawai'i Historic Places Review Board.

The Hawai'i Historic Places Review Board was established under Section 6E-5.5, Hawai'i Revised Statutes, to evaluate and determine if historic properties are to be entered into the Hawai'i Register of Historic Places and by which nominations of historic properties to the National Register of Historic Places will be approved by the Board. William Chapman is nominated to serve as a Historian on the Hawai'i Historic Places Review Board. If confirmed, William Chapman will serve until June 30, 2012.

Dr. Chapman obtained a Doctorate of Philosophy in Anthropology from the University of Oxford, a Masters of Science in Historic Preservation from Colombia University, a Masters of Studies in Anthropology from the University of Oxford, and a Bachelors of Arts in Anthropology from the University of Virginia. Dr. Chapman is currently a Professor and Director of the Historic Preservation Graduate Program at the University of Hawai'i at Manoa. Dr. Chapman previously worked as an architectural historian for the Division of Archaeology and Historic Preservation at the Virgin Islands Planning Office and as a historian for the National Park Service.

The Department greatly appreciates your consideration of Dr. William Ryan Chapman and strongly recommends his confirmation to the Hawai'i Historic Places Review Board.
