It is with pleasure that the Department of Land and Natural Resources (Department) recommends Senate confirmation of the appointment of Dr. Julie M.E. Dr. Taomia is strongly committed to preserving the history of Hawaii. She has been practicing archaeology in the Pacific since 1996 and has a strong knowledge of the archaeological resources in Hawaii.
