Title of Bill:

HB 2281 RELATING TO ALTERNATIVE ENERGY

Purpose of Bill:

Appropriates funds for grants for alternative energy utilities on public school

Department's Position:

The Department of Education supports the intent of HB 2281, which is to increase Hawaii's energy self-sufficiency. However, we believe we can achieve this result without legislation. We are about to solicit a request for proposals from private providers to purchase electricity through power purchase agreements. Under the agreement, the private providers would be responsible for installing and maintaining the alternative energy utility on the various school campuses (i.e. photovoltaic panels) and the Department would agree to purchase all power generated by the alternative energy utility at a fixed cost per kilowatt for a fixed period. This would lead to a win-win situation for the Department and the private providers. It would be a win for the private providers as they would be able to sell us electricity and take advantage of the tax credits. It would be a win for the Department as we would be able to purchase power at a fixed agreed upon rate for at least a 10 to 15 year period and the maintenance and repair of these systems would be the responsibility of the private provider.

This is the approach we are planning to take with the Act 96 pilot photovoltaic project. We are confident that we will be able to meet the goals of the pilot project at virtually little cost to the State. Thank you for the opportunity to testify on HB 2281.

HOUSE BILL NO. 2281 – RELATING TO ALTERNATIVE ENERGY.

DESCRIPTION:

This measure appropriates funds for grants for alternative energy utilities on public school campuses.

POSITION:

The Division of Consumer Advocacy ("Consumer Advocate") supports the intent of this measure, which seeks to fund a grant application program for schools to install and use renewable energy devices as learning tools for students, as long as it does not replace or adversely impact priorities as indicated in the Executive Supplemental Budget Request. We defer to the Department of Education as to the amount necessary to meaningfully allow schools to deploy such renewable energy devices.

COMMENTS:

Hawaii has an abundance of renewable energy resources which can and should be used as alternatives to fossil fuels. As the measure notes, renewable energy technologies have been successfully used by schools in Hawaii, and should be utilized more extensively by schools not only for their ability to lessen Hawaii's dependence on imported fossil fuels and decrease the overall system demand on the islands' utilities, but for their ability to teach Hawaii's keiki about energy sustainability, global climate change, stewardship of our land, science, business, and math.

As an aside, I'll note that the use of the word "utilities" is somewhat confusing. Perhaps the bill may be clarified to provide an appropriation to allow schools to purchase "alternative energy <u>devices</u>" or something similar, since commonly the word "utilities" relates to "public utilities," which are regulated by the Hawaii Public Utilities Commission.
