Testimony of Chiyome Leinaala Fukino, M.D. Director of Health

- Department's Position: We support the bill with reservations. This is a change from our initial position of opposition.
- 3 Fiscal Implications: An increase in funding and staffing will be required to adequately effect the
- 4 changes this bill would require for investigating the background of unlicensed tattoo artists applying for
- 5 temporary certificates of registration to perform tattooing in Hawaii.
- 6 Purpose and Justification: The intent of this bill is to allow unlicensed tattoo artists to practice
- 7 tattooing in Hawaii without a valid Hawaii State Tattoo License for a period of 14 (fourteen) calendar
- 8 days.
- Given the maturity of the industry and its ability to practice in a sanitary manner, we would like
- to change the previous opposition of this bill to one of support with reservations. Our information
- regarding infection rates from tattoos [Centers for Disease Control and Protection (CDC) and DOH
- Disease Investigation Branch] show that commercial tattoo artists are not responsible for significant

numbers of transmitted infections. We recommend that the regulatory system for licensing of all tattoo

artists in Hawaii be changed from licensing to one of registration whereby the department has means to

- 2 keep track of practitioners.
- We would also like to add that licensing of individuals is only one law facing tattoo artists who
- 4 want to practice in Hawaii. Our regulations only allow tattooing in a permitted tattoo establishment.
- 5 There are no provisions for a temporary tattoo shop in a convention or trade show type setting.
