HB 2366, SD1, RELATING TO THE ORGAN DONOR REGISTRY

Testimony of Chiyome Leinaala Fukino, M.D. Director of Health

- Department's Position: The Department of Health opposes HB 2366 SD 1 that establishes a statewide
- organ donor registry in the Department of Health through amending chapter 321, Hawaii Revised
- 3 Statutes. The Department does not believe statutory changes are necessary as the Hawaii Organ
- 4 Procurement Organization (dba Organ Donor Center of Hawaii) has agreed to establish and maintain a
- statewide organ donor registry. The Department prefers language reflected in SB 2104 SD1 HD1 that
- allows the Department of Health to contract with Hawaii's Organ Procurement Organization pursuant to
- 7 chapter 42F, Hawaii Revised Statutes provided it does not negatively impact the Executive
- 8 Supplemental Budget.
- 9 **Fiscal Implications:** No appropriation amount identified in the measure.
- 10 **Purpose and Justification:** The Department recognizes the importance of increasing the number of
- individuals registered as organ and tissue donors, thereby increasing the number of actual donors and
- reducing the number of individuals on the transplant list.
- 13 Currently, the only entry to enrollment as an organ donor in Hawaii is through the Department of
- Motor Vehicles driver's licensing program. This method is only available to licensed drivers, and many
- registrants do not realize that they must re-register each time they renew their driver's license. These

1	and other barriers to organ donation registration can be alleviated by establishing a statewide organ
2	donor registry that enhances the current method through the Department of Motor Vehicles.
3	The Department of Health, on behalf of the Organ Donor Registry Consortium which includes
4	the Organ Donor Center of Hawaii, the City and County of Honolulu Division of Motor Vehicles,
5	Licensing and Permits and the Hawaii Lion's Eye Bank, has submitted an application to the Health
6	Resources Administration (HRSA) intended to fund improvements to Hawaii's current organ donor
7	registry system.
