Testimony of Chiyome Leinaala Fukino, M.D. Director of Health

- Department's Position: The Department of Health supports the concept of the use of gray water from
- 2 residences for irrigation purposes but respectfully opposes this measure unless the Department can be
- 3 provided the resources to develop and implement this program without adversely affecting the priorities
- 4 in the executive's supplemental budget proposal.
- 5 **Fiscal Implications:** Yes
- 6 **Purpose and Justification:** H.B. 2779 amends Section 342D-70, Hawaii Revised Statutes to establish
- 7 rules of a gray water recycling program for residences for irrigation purposes. The department has rules
- 8 that allow for the construction and use of gray water systems for subsurface irrigation for residences
- 9 with individual wastewater systems (IWSs). The department supports the reuse of gray water for
- irrigation, however the department does not have the resources to include dwelling units that are located
- in county sewered areas.
- There is also a jurisdictional issue. Residential homes that are located in these sewer areas are
- regulated by the counties. Nationally, gray water standards for residential subsurface landscape
- irrigation are covered under the Uniform Plumbing Code (UPC) Standards that are used by the counties'
- building departments. Unfortunately, all of the counties in Hawaii deleted the reuse water and gray

- water provisions when they adopted the UPC for implementation. The department recommends that a
- 2 resolution be drafted to encourage the counties to adopt and implement the gray water standards for
- 3 residential subsurface landscape irrigation as provided under the current UPC Standards. This will let
- 4 residences served by county sewers the option to utilize their gray water for onsite irrigation.
- We will recommend that the State Building Code be written under Act 82 to allow gray water
- 6 recycling similar to the UPC.
- 7 Thank you for the opportunity to testify on this measure.

The purpose of House Bill 2779 is to amend Section 342D-70, Hawaii Revised Statutes, to require the Department of Health to establish a gray water recycling program and regulate the use of gray water in the State of Hawaii. While the Department of Land and Natural Resources (Department) supports the intent of this bill as it furthers the recycling and reuse of gray water for residential irrigation purposes, the Department however defers to the Department of Health on the practicality of implementing a gray water recycling program and regulating its use.

Gray water recycling and reuse is consistent with the policies of the Department's Commission on Water Resource Management to reserve the highest quality of water for the highest uses and to promote the augmentation and conservation of the State's water resources.
