SENATE BILL NO. 2584 RELATING TO HONEY

Chairpersons Tokuda, and Members of the Committee:

Thank you for this opportunity to provide testimony on Senate Bill No. 2584, recognizing honey as an agricultural commodity. The department supports the intent of the bill and offers a comment, we recognize the importance of the honey industry. Hawaii's honey bees are a critical part of the agricultural production chain and responsible for the pollination of many crops grown in Hawaii. The department also recognizes that local beekeepers produce one of the world's highest quality honeys.

Although the current definition of "agricultural commodity" in section 147-1 refers to fresh fruits and fresh vegetables of every kind and character, whether produced in the State or imported, the inspection of imported agricultural commodities and food products is under the jurisdiction of federal agencies, such as the United States Department of Agriculture and United States Department of Commerce. Under cooperative agreements with various federal agencies, the department is able to conduct inspections of a number of imported agricultural commodities and food products. However, honey is not currently part of these agreements. We suggest that sufficient time be allowed for implementation so that we can confer with our federal partners and establish standards and train inspectors in order for the law to be enforceable.
