SENATE BILL NO. 2584, S.D. 2 RELATING TO HONEY

Chairperson Tsuji and Members of the Committee:

Thank you for this opportunity to provide testimony on Senate Bill 2584, S.D. 2, recognizing honey as an agricultural commodity. The department supports the intent of the bill and offers comments. We recognize the importance of the honey industry. Hawaii's honey bees are a critical part of the agricultural production chain and responsible for the pollination of many crops grown in Hawaii. The department also recognizes that local beekeepers produce one of the world's highest quality honeys.

Although the current definition of "agricultural commodity" in section 147-1 refers to fresh fruits and fresh vegetables of every kind and character, whether produced in the State or imported, the inspection of imported agricultural commodities and food products are under the jurisdiction of federal agencies, such as the United States Department of Agriculture and United Stated Department of Commerce. Under cooperative agreements with various federal agencies, the department is able to conduct inspections of a number of imported agricultural commodities and food products. However, raw honey will not qualify under the U. S. Grade Standards for Extracted Honey.
