IN SUPPORT OF S.B. 3165, S.D. 1 - Relating to Taxation

I am Colette Sakoda, Principal and owner of Environmental Planning Solutions, LLC a city and regional land use and environmental planning consulting firm in Honolulu. I strongly support S.B. 3165, SD1, which provides mechanisms and opportunities to support communities affected by development arising out of construction of the transit project.

We have witnessed significant land use changes in urban Honolulu's older neighborhoods between downtown Honolulu and Waikiki with developments such as the Victoria Ward Complex, Ala Moana Center and Keeaumoku WalMart. As we foresee more changes coming with transit development traversing through these aging Honolulu neighborhoods, SB 3165, SD1, offers creative tax incentives to developers and providers of facilities and services such as moderate and low income housing, community health care facilities and related services.

S.B. 3165, SD1 creatively addresses the diverse needs of our communities in transition; and, in particular, those who are most likely to be adversely affected and disrupted by development, including transit development.

Dear Senator Fukunaga.

We have been in opposition to S.B. No. 3165, S.D. 1, as we believe it is premature. However, having said this, based on our meeting with you regarding this bill, we appreciate your desire to promote walkable communities with affordable housing and conveniences, including healthcare facilities, which accommodate the needs of the elderly and those residents at large around transit stations.

Consequently, should this bill move forward, we would want it to be amended to provide for a General Excise Tax exemption, excluding the County's surcharge, that is limited specifically and only for the development of affordable and elderly housing, including mixed use affordable and elderly housing, and community healthcare facilities around the transit stations. All other provisions of the legislation should be eliminated, including provisions relating to the operator of the county's fixed guideway transportation system and the county's budget and budgeting process

We appreciate your allowing us to comment on this bill.
