#### TESTIMONY TO THE SENATE COMMITTEE ON WAYS AND MEANS

Senate Concurrent Resolution 135 - Requesting the Legislative Reference Bureau to Survey Other States to Determine How Nursing Home Facilities in Rural Areas Address Their Transportation and Parking Issues Related to the Transport of Nursing Facility Residents

The Disability and Communication Access Board (DCAB) supports the intent of Senate Concurrent Resolution 135 with comments. This resolution arose subsequent to the demise of several bills in this year's Legislature seeking to give nursing homes and other long term care institutions eligibility to receive a parking placard for persons with disabilities. Our Board went on record opposing all those bills. We wish to reaffirm our continued opposition to the expansion of eligibility. However, we are not unsympathetic to the logistical challenges the nursing facilities face and we are willing to support a study to receive an objective assessment of how other states are addressing this issue.

We wish to note that the concerns of nursing homes are not unique, as we have heard concerns from entities such as taxis, paratransit vehicles, adult residential care homes, etc. Whatever is learned from this study will need to be viewed in the context of those agencies or organizations that all have similar interests as they transport people with disabilities to and from medical facilities or other locations in the community.

We would be willing to participate in any study or group as noted in the resolution.

#### Testimony in support of SCR 135

I am Coral Andrews, Vice President of the Healthcare Association of Hawaii, which represents the entire spectrum of health care, including acute care hospitals, two-thirds of the long term care beds in Hawaii, as well as home care and hospice providers. I regret that I shall not be able to testify in person due to a previous commitment. However, I appreciate this opportunity to submit written testimony in support of SCR 135, which requests the Legislative Reference Bureau to survey other states to determine how nursing facilities in rural areas address transportation and parking issues.

Transportation of residents from the nursing facility to external appointments (ex: doctor visit, dental visit, etc.) is an essential component of daily activities that the nursing facilities provide to their residents. Our Neighbor Island members have confirmed that the logistics of carrying out these daily support activities are difficult because the nursing facility vans used to transport residents do not qualify to park in a handicapped parking area which is often closer to the site of care. Providers describe how they often have to park a distance from the drop off site and push a wheelchair or gurney through a parking lot to the doctor's or dentist's office. In some cases, an ambulance service is contracted to provide transportation, which is not cost effective if an alternative option such as what is suggested in this resolution could be identified.

The Healthcare Association of Hawaii supports SCR 135, which encourages the identification of alternative disabled parking/transportation options for Neighbor Island providers as they strive to support the medical and dental needs of their frail and/or elderly residents.

Chair Baker and members of the Senate Ways and Means Committee, I am Debbie Shimizu, Executive Director of the National Association of Social Workers, Hawaii (NASW). I am testifying in **SUPPORT** of SCR 135 Requesting the Legislative Reference Bureau to Survey Other States to Determine How Nursing Facilities in Rural Areas Address Their Transportation and Parking Issues Related to the Transport of Nursing Facility Residents.

Thank you for hearing this resolution.

Currently, our state statute (HRS 291-51) allows only individuals with a disability to apply for and receive disabled parking placards or license plates. However, when nursing facilities transport their elderly patients to doctor's appointments, they are not able to park in parking stalls designated for the disabled. They must drop off their patients on the sidewalk and then find regular parking. This creates a vulnerable situation for the elderly who are left on the sidewalk waiting for the nursing facility staff person to take them to their doctor's office.

The Disability and Communication Access Board testified in opposition to SB 2564 which would have allowed nursing facilities to apply for and receive removable windshield placards for their vehicles that are used solely for transporting nursing facility patients for the purpose of parking in spaces reserved for persons with disabilities stating that permits and placards are only issued to people and not vehicles or agencies. However, this still does not address the problem that exists when nursing facilities need to transport their patients to doctor's appointments. This problem is much more challenging in rural areas and the neighbor islands where transportation options are limited.

We would appreciate a survey conducted by the Legislative Reference Bureau of how other states are dealing with this problem. Furthermore, we welcome a discussion with the Disability and Communication Access Board and other concerned groups to develop a possible solution to this problem.
