ARDA-Hawaii is the local chapter of the national timeshare trade association. Hawaii's timeshare industry currently accounts for over eight percent of the State's lodging inventory.

ARDA-Hawaii **supports SCR 231**, because it recognizes the need for a more effective process within the Bureau of Conveyances. SCR 231 would urge the Department of Land and Natural Resources to develop and implement a comprehensive plan to assist the Bureau in becoming more efficient, effective, and accountable.

Further, ARDA-Hawaii strongly supports any effort that would help to streamline the registration process for timeshare owners. Currently every timeshare owner is issued a certificate of title to each timeshare unit owner, which amounts to thousands of individual owners. The Land Court System was not created nor designed to handle multiple ownership conveyances in bulk and all the compliance issues that are required in the timeshare registration process. ARDA-Hawaii believes that one way to assist in streamlining the Bureau of Conveyances is to deregister fee simple timeshare interest from the Land Court system. Doing such would eliminate that process while maintaining adequate protection of ownership.

March 25, 2008

Senate Concurrent Resolution 231 urges the Department of Land and Natural Resources (Department) to develop and implement a comprehensive plan to assist the Bureau of Conveyances (Bureau) in becoming a more efficient, effective, and accountable operation, and develop strategic initiatives for the Bureau. The Department has already developed such a plan and begun implementation, and therefore, this concurrent resolution is unnecessary.

The Department has already entered into a contract with Hawaii Information Consortium LLC to develop the process of online filings that will benefit the general public in transferring real property under an enhanced and secure process. The Department notes that the Hawaii Information Consortium LLC has implemented similar programs for other jurisdictions in the United States

This contract is to implement suggestions from the Working Group created in October 2007 consisting of representatives from the title industry, lending, realtor and bar associations, Judiciary, Hawaii Government Employees Association and the Department of the Attorney General. For the first time in over a decade, we have agreement in proceeding with an automation plan to enhance the Bureau's ability to service the public and introduced three administrative bills to address various concerns that were raised within the group.

Automation through electronic filings is currently being utilized by the Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs and the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations. This has resulted in increased benefits to the public as well as hundreds of recording offices throughout the United States.

The Department strongly supports contents of the Administration's proposal, House Bill 3172 (RELATING TO ELECTRONIC FILINGS IN THE BUREAU OF CONVEYANCES AND THE OFFICE OF THE ASSISTANT REGISTRAR) that addresses the recommendations of the Working Group to automate the recording process. The Department strongly urges agreement by the Senate and the House of Representatives to change the law to accept electronic filings on line
