## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to repeal the				
2	district business and fiscal officer positions within the				
3	department of education. In lieu of these positions, the				
4	legislature has provided for one business manager position for				
5	each of the fifteen complex areas to support the schools and				
6	officers within each complex.				
7	SECTION 2. Section 302A-604.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is				
8	repealed.

10	The department shall establish eight permanent civil service				
11	exempt full time equivalent business and fiscal officer				
12	positions; provided that four business and fiscal officer				
13	positions shall be assigned to the Oahu school districts, with
