## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO INVESTIGATORS OF THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that for the State to
- 2 comply with the settlement agreement between the State and the
- 3 United States Department of Justice concerning conditions at the
- 4 Hawaii youth correctional facilities, the State must be able to
- 5 investigate incidents of use of force, staff-on-youth violence,
- 6 serious youth-on-youth violence, inappropriate staff
- 7 relationships with youth, sexual misconduct between youth, and
- 8 abusive institutional practices at the Hawaii youth correctional
- 9 facilities. Although pursuant to section 346-4.5, Hawaii
- 10 Revised Statutes, the director of human services has broad
- 11 authority to appoint and commission investigators and those
- 12 investigators are authorized to access information maintained by
- 13 any state or county entity, the statute does not state
- 14 specifically that investigators have the authority to access
- 15 information necessary to investigate incidents at the Hawaii
- 16 youth correctional facilities.
