BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to repeal two
2	subsections of the Hawaii Revised Statutes regarding the cost of
3	electricity and maintenance for air conditioners not installed
4	by the department of accounting and general services and repair
5	and maintenance for donated fixtures and equipment.
6	SECTION 2. Section 302A-1501, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
7	amended to read as follows:
8	"[+]\$302A-1501[+] Noise and climate control at school
9	facilities. [-(a)-] The department shall plan for, and request
10	appropriations necessary to implement, acoustic noise control
11	and air conditioning of existing and new school facilities in
12	areas that are susceptible to extremes of temperature or
13	affected by aircraft, traffic, and other noise. The department
14	shall develop appropriate standards and consider local
15	conditions for deciding whether acoustic noise control and air
16	conditioning of existing and new school facilities are required
17	for effective classroom instruction. In all cases where
18	acoustic treatment of school facilities is planned, the

1 department shall utilize the services of individuals qualified 2 by training and experience to recommend appropriate noise control procedures and components. Acoustic noise control and 3 air conditioning shall be given equal weight as all other 4 5 factors in the criteria used by the department in setting 6 priorities for school construction and renovations. 7 [(b) In any case where air conditioners are installed in a particular school, the department may require that the 8 approximate cost of electricity and maintenance for air 10 conditioners not installed by the department of accounting and general services be paid by a private entity until the 11 **12** department establishes temperature and noise standards and a 13 policy relating to air conditioning.]" 14 SECTION 3. Section 302A-1503, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 15 amended to read as follows: "[+]\$302A-1503[+] Donated school equipment and fixtures; 16 **17** repair and maintenance responsibility. (a) The department may 18 accept donations of school equipment or fixtures on behalf of 19 the department, individual schools, or school complexes. 20 Donations that meet current educational specifications or exceed existing educational specifications shall be deemed acceptable 21 in instances where the donations enhance the school environment 22

    or improve the administration of school programs in accordance

          (b) In the case of fixtures that are to be installed in

    existing or new school facilities, the department of accounting
