## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

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1	SECT	ION 1. Section 291-34, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended b	y amending subsection (c) to read as follows:
3	"(C)	Length:
4	(1)	No single motor vehicle or other power vehicle having
5		a total overall length greater than forty-five feet,
6		including load, shall be operated or moved upon any
7		public road, street, or highway within the State,
8		except as provided in this subsection;
9	(2)	No truck-tractor and semitrailer having a total
10		overall length greater than sixty-five feet, including
11		load, shall be operated or moved upon any public road,
12		street, or highway, other than interstate highways and
13		certain qualifying federal aid highways as designated
14		by the director of transportation, within the State,
15		except as provided in this subsection; provided that:
16		(A) For truck-tractors and semitrailers used for
17		agricultural purposes[-] and public utilities
18		maintenance and service vehicles, [or articulated

1			buses for public transit purposes, the total	
2			combined length of the truck-tractor and	
3			semitrailer[7] or public utility maintenance and	
4			service vehicle[, or articulated bus] shall not	
5			exceed sixty-five feet in length; [and]	
6		(B)	The length of the semitrailer shall not exceed	
7			forty-eight feet in length; and	
8		<u>(C)</u>	The length of an articulated bus for public	
9			transit purposes shall not exceed eighty-two feet	
10			in length, and shall not consist of more than	
11			three units;	
12	(3)	No c	ombination of motor vehicles or other power	
13		vehi	cles coupled together shall consist of more than	
14		two	units and no [such] combination of vehicles having	
15		a total overall length greater than sixty-five feet,		
16		incl	uding load, shall be operated or moved upon any	
17		publ	ic road, street, or highway other than interstate	
18		high	ways and certain qualifying federal aid highways	
19		as d	designated by the director of transportation,	

within the State, except as provided in this

subsection. A truck-tractor and semitrailer shall be

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1		regarded a	as a single unit when determining the number
2		of units	in a combination;
3	(4)	No motor	vehicle, self-propelled construction or farm
4		equipment	, trailer, or semitrailer shall be operated
5		upon any p	oublic road, street, or highway within the
6		State if	it is carrying or otherwise has projecting to
7		the front	or rear, a load, boom, mast, or other
8		projecting	g structure or attachment unless:
9		(A) With	respect to self-propelled construction or
10		farm	equipment:
11		(i)	The length of the equipment measured on a
12			horizontal axis, including the projection,
13			is not greater than forty-five feet;
14		(ii)	The projection is either held securely in
15			place or is controlled by the driver or an
16			operator;
17		(iii)	The projection does not obstruct the
18			driver's vision;
19		(iv)	The projection does not impair the driver's
20			ability to control the equipment:

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1		(v)	The projection beyond the front tires is at
2			least seven feet above the roadway surface;
3			and
4		(vi)	The projection does not extend more than
5			four feet past the extremity of the piece of
6			equipment, or if it extends more than four
7			feet, an escort vehicle is provided by the
8			owner or operator either to the front or to
9			the rear of the projection to call attention
10			to the projection; or
11	(B)	With	respect to a motor vehicle, or a motor
12		vehi	cle with attached trailer or semitrailer:
13		(i)	The overall length of a motor vehicle
14			including the projection, is not greater
15			than forty-five feet or the overall length
16			of the motor vehicle with attached trailer
17			or semitrailer, including the projection, is
18		•	not greater than sixty feet except that this
19			limitation on a motor vehicle with attached
20			trailer or semitrailer, including the
21			projection, shall not be applicable on
22			interstate highways and certain qualifying

1		federal aid highways, as designated by the
2		director of transportation;
3	(ii)	The projection is either held securely in
4		place or is controlled by the driver or an
5		operator;
6	(iii)	The projection does not obstruct the
7		driver's vision;
8	(iv)	The projection does not impair the driver's
9		ability to control the equipment;
10	(v)	The projection beyond the front tires is at
11		least seven feet above the roadway surface;
12		and
13	(vi)	The projection does not extend more than
14		four feet past the extremity of the trailer
15		or semitrailer, or, if it extends more than
16		four feet, an escort vehicle is provided by
17		the owner or operator either to the front or
18		to the rear of the projection to call
19		attention to the projection;
20	(5) The limit	ations in this subsection upon length shall
21	not apply	to vehicles transporting pipe, poles,
22	timbers,	reinforcing steel, structural steel, or other
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1	objects of a structural nature [which] that cannot be
2	readily dismembered; provided that when transported by
3	night every [such] vehicle shall be equipped with a
4	sufficient number of clearance lamps upon the extreme
5	ends of any projecting load to clearly mark the
6	dimensions of the load."
7	SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
3	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
)	SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
