## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE BUDGET OF THE OFFICE OF HAWAIIAN AFFAIRS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to appropriate funds
- 2 for the biennial budget of the office of Hawaiian affairs and
- 3 this Act shall be known and may be cited as the "Office of
- 4 Hawaiian Affairs Appropriations Act of 2009."
- 5 SECTION 2. Unless otherwise clear from the context, as
- 6 used in this Act:
- 7 "Program ID" means the unique identifier of the specific
- 8 program, and consists of the abbreviation for the office of
- 9 Hawaiian affairs followed by a designated number for the
- 10 program.
- "Means of financing," or "MOF," means the source from which
- 12 funds are appropriated or authorized, as the case may be, to be
- 13 expended for the programs and projects specified in this Act.
- 14 Letter symbols following appropriations have the following
- 15 meanings:
- 16 A: General Funds
- 17 T: Trust Funds

Ţ	"Position ceiling" means the maximum number of permanent
2	positions authorized for a particular program during a specified
3	period or periods, as noted by an asterisk.
4	SECTION 3. The following sums, or so much thereof as may
5	be necessary to accomplish the purposes and programs designated
6	herein, are appropriated or authorized, as the case may be, from
7	the sources of funding specified to the office of Hawaiian
_	

- 8 affairs for the fiscal biennium beginning July 1, 2009 and
- 9 ending June 30, 2011. The total general fund expenditures and
- 10 the number of permanent positions established in each fiscal
- 11 year of the biennium shall not exceed the sums and the position
- 12 ceiling indicated for each year, except as provided elsewhere in
- 13 this Act.

- 1 SECTION 4. Provided that the general fund appropriations
- 2 in section 3 of this Act shall be expended by the office of
- 3 Hawaiian affairs.
- 4 SECTION 5. Provided that of the funds appropriated for
- 5 beneficiary advocacy (OHA 175), the sum of \$381,020 in general
- 6 funds and \$381,020 in trust funds for fiscal year 2009-2010 and
- 7 the sum of \$381,020 in general funds and \$381,020 in trust funds
- 8 for fiscal year 2010-2011 shall provide for social services to
- 9 office of Hawaiian affairs beneficiaries to include information
- 10 and referral services, case management and counseling,
- 11 establishment of individual development accounts, financial
- 12 literacy, and financial assistance. Referral services include
- 13 those relating to education assistance, employment and income
- 14 security, individual and family care, health needs, housing,
- 15 legal services, genealogy research, business assistance, and
- 16 general information; provided further that notwithstanding
- 17 section 10-17(e), Hawaii Revised Statutes, any funds expended
- 18 for the purposes of this section shall be in accordance with
- 19 chapter 103D or 103F, Hawaii Revised Statutes, as appropriate.
- 20 SECTION 6. Provided that of the funds appropriated for
- 21 beneficiary advocacy (OHA 175), the sum of \$596,668 in general
- 22 funds and \$596,668 in trust funds for fiscal year 2009-2010 and

- the sum of \$615,570 in general funds and \$615,570 in trust fundsfor fiscal year 2010-2011 shall provide for educational
- 3 enrichment programs for native Hawaiian children in grades K
- 4 through 12 throughout the State. Program activities are to be
- 5 designed to optimize learning for Hawaiian students and are
- 6 intended to develop a stronger interest in learning, connect
- 7 learning and education to one's Hawaiian identity, and explore
- 8 possible educational, career, and academic goals the students
- 9 may not have considered; provided further that notwithstanding
- 10 section 10-17(e), Hawaii Revised Statutes, any funds expended
- 11 for the purposes of this section shall be in accordance with
- 12 chapter 103D or 103F, Hawaii Revised Statutes, as appropriate.
- 13 SECTION 7. Provided that of the funds appropriated for
- 14 beneficiary advocacy (OHA 175), the sum of \$491,981 in general
- 15 funds and \$491,981 in trust funds for fiscal year 2009-2010 and
- 16 the sum of \$473,080 in general funds and \$473,080 in trust funds
- 17 for fiscal year 2010-2011 shall provide legal services and legal
- 18 representation to office of Hawaiian affairs beneficiaries for:
- 19 the assertion and defense of quiet title action assistance with
- 20 ahupua`a and kuleana tenant rights, including rights of access
- 21 and rights to water; land title assistance, including review of
- 22 title and genealogy; preservation of traditional and customary

- 1 practices; protection of culturally significant places; and
- 2 preservation of native Hawaiian land trust entitlements;
- 3 provided further that notwithstanding section 10-17(e), Hawaii
- 4 Revised Statutes, any funds expended for the purposes of this
- 5 section shall be in accordance with chapter 103D or 103F, Hawaii
- 6 Revised Statutes, as appropriate.
- 7 SECTION 8. Provided that of the general fund appropriation
- 8 for the office of Hawaiian affairs (OHA 175), the sum of \$87,768
- 9 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2009-2010
- 10 and the sum of \$87,768 or so much thereof as may be necessary
- 11 for fiscal year 2010-2011 shall be expended to establish the
- 12 Achieving the Dream Initiative for Native Hawaiian students
- 13 located at the Hawaii Community College; provided further that
- 14 the funds in fiscal year 2009-2010 and fiscal year 2010-2011
- 15 shall be expended to fund three (3.00 FTE) positions; provided
- 16 further that these funds shall not be expended for any other
- 17 purpose; provided further that no funds shall be expended unless
- 18 matched on a 1:1 basis by a trust fund expenditure by the office
- 19 of Hawaiian affairs; and provided further that any unexpended
- 20 funds shall lapse to the general fund.
- 21 SECTION 9. Provided that of the general fund appropriation
- 22 for the office of Hawaiian affairs (OHA 175), the sum of \$70,000

- 1 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2009-2010
- 2 and the sum of \$70,000 or so much thereof as may be necessary
- 3 for fiscal year 2010-2011 shall be expended to establish a
- 4 research and training program for native Hawaiian students of
- 5 the Hawaii Institute of Marine Biology; provided further that
- 6 these funds shall not be expended for any other purpose;
- 7 provided further that no funds shall be expended unless matched
- 8 on a 1:1 basis by a trust fund expenditure by the office of
- 9 Hawaiian affairs; and provided further that any unexpended funds
- 10 shall lapse to the general fund.
- 11 SECTION 10. Provided that whenever the need arises, the
- 12 board of trustees of the office of Hawaiian affairs or their
- 13 designee is authorized to transfer sufficient funds and
- 14 positions between programs for operating purposes; provided
- 15 further that these transfers shall not be inconsistent with
- 16 legislative intent; and provided further that a report of these
- 17 fund transfers shall be made to the legislature no later than
- 18 thirty days prior to the convening of the 2010 and 2011 regular
- 19 sessions.
- 20 SECTION 11. If any portion of this Act or its application
- 21 to any person or circumstances is held to be invalid for any
- 22 reason, the remainder of the Act and any provision thereof shall

- 1 not be affected. If any portion of a specific appropriation is
- 2 held to be invalid for any reason, the remaining portion shall
- 3 be independent of the invalid portion and shall be expended to
- 4 fulfill the objective and intent of the appropriation to the
- 5 extent possible.
- 6 SECTION 12. In the event manifest clerical, typographical,
- 7 or other mechanical errors are found in this Act, the board of
- 8 trustees of the office of Hawaiian affairs is hereby authorized
- 9 to correct such errors. All changes made pursuant to this
- 10 section shall be reported to the legislature at its next
- 11 session.
- 12 SECTION 13. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2009.
