A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE HUMANE TREATMENT OF PET ANIMALS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 711-1109, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended by amending subsections (1) and (2) to read as follows: 2 A person commits the offense of cruelty to animals in 3 the second degree if the person intentionally, knowingly, or 5 recklessly: 6 (a) Overdrives, overloads, tortures, torments, beats, 7 causes substantial bodily injury, or starves any 8 animal, or causes the overdriving, overloading, 9 torture, torment, beating, or starving of any animal[7] 10 or deprives]; 11 (b) Deprives a pet animal of necessary sustenance or causes such deprivation; 12 13 [-(b)-] (c) Mutilates, poisons, or kills without need any 14 animal other than insects, vermin, or other pests; [-(c)]Keeps, uses, or in any way is connected with or 15 (d) 16 interested in the management of, or receives money for 17 the admission of any person to, any place kept or used

1		for the purpose of fighting or baiting any bull, bear,
2		cock, or other animal, and <u>includes</u> every person who
3		encourages, aids, or assists therein, or who permits
4		or suffers any place to be so kept or used;
5	[-(d) -]	(e) Carries or causes to be carried, in or upon any
6		vehicle or other conveyance, any animal in a cruel or
7		inhumane manner; [ex]
8	<u>(f)</u>	Confines or causes to be confined, in a kennel or
9		cage, any pet animal in a cruel or inhumane manner;
10	<u>(g)</u>	Tethers, fastens, ties, or restrains a dog to a dog
11		house, tree, fence, or any other stationary object by
12		means of a choke collar, pinch collar, or prong
13		collar; provided that a person is not prohibited from
14		using such restraints when walking a dog with a hand-
15		held leash or while a dog is engaged in a supervised
16		activity; or
17	[-(e)]	(h) Assists another in the commission of any act
18		specified in subsections (1)(a) through $[\frac{(1)(d)}{(d)}]$
19		(1)(g).
20	(2)	Subsection (1)(a), (b), [(d), and] <u>(c), (e), (f), (g),</u>

11	the offen	se of animal hoarding if the person intentionally,
12	knowingly	, or recklessly:
13	(a)	Possesses more than [twenty] fifteen dogs, cats, or a
14		combination of dogs and cats;
15	(b)	Fails to provide necessary sustenance for each dog or
16		cat; and
17	(c)	Fails to correct the conditions under which the dogs
18		or cats are living, where conditions injurious to the
19		dogs', cats', or owner's health and well-being result
20		from the person's failure to provide necessary
21		sustenance."

- 1 SECTION 3. Act 128, Session Laws of Hawaii 2008, is
- 2 amended by amending section 7 to read as follows:
- 3 "SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect upon its approval
- 4 and shall be repealed on July 1, [2011.] 2015."
- 5 SECTION 4. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 6 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 7 begun, before its effective date.
- 8 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 9 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 10 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2009.
