A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TORT LIABILITY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	PART I
2	SECTION 1. The liability protections afforded to
3	lifeguards in Act 170, Session Laws of Hawaii 2002 (Act 170),
4	will sunset on June 30, 2010. Act 170 provides liability
5	protection for lifeguard services on the beach or in the ocean,
6	except for gross negligence or wanton acts or omissions. This
7	limited liability protection was made necessary because some
8	counties would not provide lifeguard services at state beach
9	parks, due to the fear of potential liability that might ensue.
10	The legislature finds that Act 170 created a climate in which
11	lifeguard services could be provided by the counties without
12	fear of liability, and, therefore, is a life-saving measure that
13	should be extended.
14	The purpose of this part is to extend the liability
15	protections for lifequard services.
