A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FEDERAL FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE FOR INDEPENDENT LIVING SERVICES AND CENTERS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The statewide council on independent living was
- 2 created by Act 197, Session Laws of Hawaii 1993 (codified as
- 3 section 348-9, Hawaii Revised Statutes), and placed within the
- 4 department of human services.
- 5 Act 84, Session Laws of Hawaii 1995, removed the statewide
- 6 council on independent living from the department of human
- 7 services to conform with the 1992 amendment to the federal
- 8 Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended, title 29 United States
- 9 Code section 796d, which requires states to establish a
- 10 statewide independent living council to receive federal
- 11 financial assistance and prohibited a statewide independent
- 12 living council from being placed within a state agency in order
- 13 to receive the federal financial assistance. Act 84 retained
- 14 the statewide council on independent living but made the
- 15 statewide council on independent living a temporary agency with
- 16 a repeal date of June 30, 1998, at which time section 348-9 was
- 17 to be reenacted. On June 30, 1998, Act 84 was repealed and the

- 1 statewide council on independent living was again
- 2 administratively placed in the department of human services. No
- 3 other laws were passed after 1998 to remove the statewide
- 4 council on independent living from placement in the department
- 5 of human services.
- 6 Federal law, title 29 United States Code section 796d,
- 7 still requires the State to establish a statewide independent
- 8 living council, which still cannot be established as an entity
- 9 within a state agency for the State to be eligible to receive
- 10 federal financial assistance.
- 11 Section 348-9, Hawaii Revised Statutes, was well intended,
- 12 but it does not conform to the federal requirements for a
- 13 statewide independent living council, and has resulted in
- 14 confusion. Repealing section 348-9 will abolish the
- 15 nonconforming statewide council on independent living.
- The purposes of this bill are to repeal section 348-9,
- 17 Hawaii Revised Statutes, to abolish the statewide council on
- 18 independent living established within the department of human
- 19 services in section 348-9, Hawaii Revised Statutes, to conform
- 20 to federal law, which prohibits a statewide independent living
- 21 council from being within a state agency, and to thereby allow
- 22 for compliance with the federal requirement for the receipt of

federal financial assistance through the preparation of the 1 2 state plan that is required by federal law. SECTION 2. Section 348-9, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 3 repealed. 4 ["§348-9 Statewide council on independent living. (a) 5 6 There is established within the department of human services a statewide council on independent living. The council shall 7 consist of nineteen members appointed by the governor as 8 provided in section 26 34 and without regard to section 78 4. 9 The members shall include: 10 (1) At least one director of a center [for] independent 11 living chosen by the directors of centers for 12 independent living; 13 (2) An employee of the department as an ex officio 14 nonvoting member; and 15 (3) Members of other state agencies that provide services 16 for individuals with disabilities as ex officio 17 nonvoting members. 18 19 (b) The council may also include: 20 (1) Additional representatives from centers for independent living; 21

1	(2) Parents and guardians of individuals with
2	disabilities;
3	(3) Advocates of and for individuals with disabilities;
4	(4) Representatives from private business;

7	(6) Other appropriate individuals;
8	provided that the council shall include at least one member from
9	each county; and provided further that a majority of the council
10	shall be individuals with disabilities who are not employed by
11	any state agency or center for independent living. The council
12	shall elect a chairperson from the membership. Each member
13	shall serve a term of three years and may not serve more than
14	two consecutive full terms.
15	(c) The council members shall serve without compensation
16	but shall be reimbursed for reasonable expenses, including
17	travel expenses, necessary for the performance of their duties.
18	(d) The council shall:
19	(1) Develop and submit jointly with the department a state
20	plan;
21	(2) Monitor, review, and evaluate the implementation of
22	the state plan;

1	(3) Coordinate activities with the state rehabilitation
2	council; and
3	(4) Submit to the commissioner of the rehabilitation
4	services administration such periodic reports as are
5	requested."]
6	SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
7	and stricken.
8	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

TITLE:

SERVICES AND CENTERS.

PURPOSE:

To abolish the Statewide Council on Independent Living (SCIL), established within the Department of Human Services in section 348-9, Hawaii Revised Statutes, to conform to federal law. Federal law, title 29 United States Code section 796d, requires the State to establish a statewide independent living council, which cannot be established as an entity within a state agency for the State to be eligible to receive federal financial assistance.

MEANS:

Repeal section 348-9, Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS).

JUSTIFICATION:

The Statewide Council on Independent Living was created by Act 197, Session Laws of Hawaii 1993 (codified as section 348-9, Hawaii Revised Statutes), and placed within the department of human services.

Act 84, Session Laws of Hawaii 1995, removed the statewide council on independent living from the department of human services to conform with the 1992 amendment to the federal Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended, title 29 United States Code section 796d, which requires states to establish a statewide independent living council to receive federal financial assistance and prohibited a statewide independent living council from being placed within a state agency in order to receive the federal financial assistance. Act 84 retained the statewide council on independent living but made the statewide council on independent living a temporary agency with a repeal date of June 30, 1998, at which time section 3489 was to be reenacted. On June 30, 1998, Act 84 was repealed and the statewide council on independent living was again administratively placed in the department of human services. No other laws were passed after 1998 to remove the statewide council on independent living from placement in the department of human services.

Federal law, title 29 United States Code section 796d, still requires the State to establish a statewide independent living council, which still cannot be established as an entity within a state agency for the State to be eligible to receive federal financial assistance.

Section 348-9, Hawaii Revised Statutes, was well intended, but it does not conform to the federal requirements for a statewide independent living council, and has resulted in confusion. Repealing section 348-9 will abolish the nonconforming statewide council on independent living.

Repealing section 348-9, Hawaii Revised Statutes, to abolish the statewide council to conform to federal law, which prohibits a statewide independent living council from being within a state agency, will allow for compliance with the federal requirement for the receipt of federal financial assistance through the preparation of the state plan that is required by federal law.

Impact on the public: Eliminate confusion as to the status of the statewide independent living council. The State will continue to receive federal financial assistance to be used for services to those eligible.
