A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO STATE SALARIES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 78-12, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by amending subsection (f) to read as follows:
3	"(f) Regardless of whether a contested determination of
4	indebtedness is pending, the disbursing officer shall commence
5	immediate recovery of the indebtedness as provided in this
6	$\operatorname{subsection}\left[\div \right]$; provided that a recovery shall not commence after
7	two years from the date of the indebtedness. If the
8	indebtedness is equal to or less than \$1,000, the disbursing
9	officer shall immediately deduct from any subsequent periodic
10	payment normally due the employee any amount up to the total
11	amount of indebtedness and for indebtedness greater than \$1,000,
12	the disbursing officer shall deduct:
13	(1) An amount agreed to by the employee and the appointing
14	authority, but not less than \$100 per pay period; or
15	(2) One-quarter of the salary, wages, or compensation due
16	the employee until the indebtedness is repaid in full.
17	In addition to paragraph (1), an employee and the appointing

- 1 indebtedness by applying the current value of appropriate leave
- 2 or compensatory time credits posted in the employee's respective
- 3 accounts as balances that would otherwise be payable in cash
- 4 upon separation from service; provided that credits shall not be
- 5 applied to any extent that would require a refund of any moneys
- 6 already deducted or repaid or that would require the payment of
- 7 any moneys to the employee equivalent to a cashing out of leave
- 8 or compensatory time credits."
- 9 SECTION 2. Section 431:19-101.6, Hawaii Revised Statutes,
- 10 is amended to read as follows:
- 11 "[+]§431:19-101.6[+] Salary. The salary of the
- 12 administrator shall be set by the director of commerce and
- 13 consumer affairs, but shall not be more than [ninety-five per
- 14 cent of the maximum salary of the commissioner.] the maximum
- 15 salary of the first deputy to the director of commerce and
- 16 consumer affairs."
- 17 SECTION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 18 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 19 begun, before its effective date.
- 20 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 21 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 22 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
