A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ABANDONED VEHICLES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 290-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
3	"(a) The counties may cause vehicles that have been
4	abandoned to be taken into custody and disposed of. For the
5	purposes of this subsection, a vehicle is "abandoned" if it is
6	defined to be abandoned by an ordinance of the county in which
7	the vehicle is located. In the absence of such an ordinance, a
8	vehicle is "abandoned" if it is left unattended for a continuous
9	period of more than twenty-four hours and it is unlawfully
10	parked on [any]:
11	(1) Any public highway or other public property; or
12	(2) Any private road or private lands defined as a
13	setback, shoulder, easement, or right of way that is
14	adjacent to or part of a private or public highway[\div];
15	provided that a vehicle on a private road shall be
16	considered unlawfully parked if:
17	(A) It is inoperable; and

1	(B) The owner or at least one of the co-owners of the
2	private road requests in writing to the
3	appropriate county authority for the removal of
4	the vehicle.
5	The owner of a private road requesting the removal of an
6	abandoned vehicle shall pay the county for the removal of the
7	vehicle and is deemed to agree to indemnify and hold the county
8	harmless for any claims against the county for the removal and
9	disposal of the vehicle. The mayors of the several counties may
10	designate an agency within their counties to carry out the
11	functions and requirements of this section. The term "agency"
12	means any office, department, or other governmental unit of the
13	county."
14	SECTION 2. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
15	matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
16	begun, before its effective date.
17	SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
18	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
19	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050 and
20	shall be repealed on June 30, 2052; provided that section 290-1,
21	Hawaii Revised Statutes, shall be reenacted in the form in which

Abandoned Vehicles; Private Roads; Counties

Description:

Allows counties to remove abandoned motor vehicles from private roads; requires owners of private roads to request removal in writing before vehicle is considered abandoned; requires private road owner to pay for removal and indemnify county for claims arising from removal and disposal. Effective 7/1/2050. Sunset 6/30/2052. (SD1)
