## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PUBLIC WORKS.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 104-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

15	associated provisions shall be deemed the prevailing wages and	
16	terms serving as the basis of compliance with this [section]

- 3 SECTION 2. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 4 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were

- 8 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2020.

## Report Title:

Public Works; Special Purpose Revenue Bonds; Prevailing Wages

## Description:

Requires that the collective bargaining agreement be submitted to the director of labor and industrial relations in order for the terms in the agreement to dictate the prevailing wages with regard to a project financed through the issuance of a special purpose revenue bond. Effective 07/01/2020. (SD1)
