A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO DEAD HUMAN BODIES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 327-38, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended to read as follows:
3	"§327-38 Prohibitions; penalty. (a) No person shall
4	give, offer, or promise any money or other things of value to
5	any other person in consideration of receiving a dead human
6	body.
7	(b) No person shall provide a dead human body to any other
8	person in consideration of any money or other things of value,
9	or any offer or promise of money or other things of value.
10	(c) No person shall display a dead human body for
11	commercial purposes; provided that this subsection shall not
12	apply to a display of a dead human body that:
13	(1) Has been dead for more than eighty years;
14	(2) Consists solely of human teeth or hair;
15	(3) Is part of the ordinary display or viewing of the
16	deceased at a funeral establishment or part of a
17	similar funeral or memorial service;
18	(4) Is an object of religious veneration;

2		possession of any federal, state, or county agency,
3		any public or private institution of higher learning

8	[-(b)] (d) No university, hospital, or institution shall

16	(1)	An individual who has sustained either irreversible
17		cessation of circulatory and respiratory functions or
18		irreversible cessation of all functions of the entire
19		brain, including the brain stem; provided that the
20		determination of death be made in accordance with
21		accepted medical standards; and

1	(2)	Includes plastinated human bodies or remains,
2		including tissue, organs, and other body parts, that
3		are preserved from decay by replacing the water and
4		fats in the human remains with a polymer.
5	<u>"Mus</u>	eum facility" means a public or private nonprofit
6	instituti	on that:
7	(1)	Is accredited by the American Association of Museums
8		or is part of an accredited college or university;
9	(2)	Is organized on a permanent basis for essentially
10		educational or aesthetic purposes; and
11	(3)	Owns or uses tangible objects, cares for those
12		objects, and exhibits them to the general public on a
13		regular basis."
14	SECT	TION 2. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
15	matured,	penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
16	begun, be	efore its effective date.

Dead Bodies; Prohibitions; Penalty

Description:

Adds to the prohibition against buying dead human bodies, the selling and commercial display of dead human bodies. Defines the terms "dead human body" and "museum facility." Increases the fine for violations to up to \$5,000. (HB28 CD1)
