A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTH.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Section 37-52.3,		
2	Hawaii Revised Statutes, requires a special fund to reflect a		
3	clear nexus between the benefits sought and the charges made		
4	upon the users or beneficiaries of the program, as opposed to		
5	serving primarily as a means of providing the program or users		
6	with an automatic means of support that is removed from the		
7	normal budget and appropriations process.		
8	The legislature further finds that there is a need to		
9	clarify the nexus between the benefits sought and charges made		
10	on the users and beneficiaries of the environmental health		
11	education fund. The fund is the depository of fees collected by		
12	the department of health for permits, licenses, inspections,		
13	various certificates, variances, investigations, and reviews		
14	respecting:		
15	(1) Certain occupations, practices, and persons that the		
16	department deems necessary to regulate for public		
17	health or safety reasons under section 321-13, Hawaii		
18	Revised Statutes, including clinical laboratory		

Revised Statutes, including clinical laboratory

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1	di	rectors, scientists, specialists, and technicians;
2	cyt	otechnologists; tattoo artists; and environmental
3	hea	alth professionals; and
4	(2) Fac	cilities seeking licensure or certification, except
5	cei	tain types of health care facilities including
6	hos	spitals, nursing homes, freestanding outpatient
7	sui	gical facilities, care centers, laboratories, and
8	spe	cial treatment centers, as provided in section 321-
9	11	5, Hawaii Revised Statutes.
10	Section	321-27, Hawaii Revised Statutes, requires the
11	department of	health to expend the moneys in the environmental
12	health educat	ion fund to enhance the capacity of the
13	environmenta	health programs.
14	The leg	slature further finds that over ninety percent of
15	the fees depo	sited into the environmental health education fund
16	are collected	by the sanitation branch of the department of
17	health's env	ronmental health services division. The sanitation
18	branch is cha	arged with implementing programs related to:
19	(1) Foo	od protection;
20	(2) The	e regulation of barber shops, beauty parlors,
21	mas	ssage parlors, tattoo shops, mortuaries, public
22	swi	mming pools, and public laundries;

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1	(3)	The inspection of tenement houses, lodging houses,
2		boarding houses, and hotels;
3	(4)	The licensing of tattoo artists and embalmers; and
4	(5)	Enforcing the sanitation requirements for hospitals
5		and medical facilities.
6	While	the legislature recognizes the importance of
7	providing	a dedicated source of funding for environmental health
8	education	activities, the legislature acknowledges that in this
9	case the f	ees collected must more directly benefit the fee
10	payers.	
11	The p	ourpose of this bill is to
12	(1)	Change the name of the environmental health education
13		fund to the sanitation and environmental health
14		special fund; and
15	(2)	Allow the use of fund monies for sanitation program
16		activities.
17	SECTI	ON 2. Section 321-11.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
18	amended by	amending subsection (c) to read as follows:
19	"(c)	Other than the fees collected under subsection (b),
20	all other	fees collected under this section and section 321-15
21	shall be d	deposited into the sanitation and environmental health

[education] special fund established under section 321-27."

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1 SECTION 3. Section 321-15, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows: 3 "(a) Every person holding a license to practice any 4 occupation specified in section 321-13(a)(1) shall reregister 5 with the department of health every other year in accordance 6 with the rules of the department, before February 1 except where 7 superseded by federal law, and shall pay a reregistration fee. 8 The failure, neglect, or refusal of any person holding such a 9 license to reregister or pay the reregistration fee, after 10 thirty days of delinquency, shall constitute a forfeiture of the 11 person's license; provided that the license shall be restored 12 upon written application therefor together with a payment of all 13 delinquent fees and an additional late reregistration fee that 14 may be established by the director of health. All fees 15 collected pursuant to this section shall be deposited into the 16 sanitation and environmental health [education] special fund 17 established under section 321-27." SECTION 4. Section 321-27, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 18 19 amended to read as follows: 20 [Environmental] Sanitation and environmental 21 health [education] special fund. (a) There is established

11	(1)	Improve public outreach efforts and consultations to		
12		businesses and industries regulated;		
13	(2)	Educate the public, staff, regulated businesses and		
14		industries [regulated thereunder];		
15	(3)	Plan for future growth and expansion to meet emerging		
16		needs; and		
17	(4)	Provide training opportunities to ensure the		
18		maintenance of professional competence among		
19		sanitation and environmental health staff and		
20		administrators[-		
21	Not]	; provided that for environmental health programs, not		

more than \$90,000 of the fund may be utilized during any fiscal

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- 1 year for fund administration, including the hiring of not more
- 2 than two full-time equivalent personnel, and the purchase of
- 3 office and electronic equipment.
- 4 (c) Any amount in the fund in excess of [\$300,000]
- 5 \$2,445,000 on June 30 of each year shall be deposited into the
- 6 general fund.
- 7 (d) The department of health shall submit a report to the
- 8 legislature concerning the status of the sanitation and
- 9 environmental health [education] special fund, including, but
- 10 not limited to, the amount of moneys taken in by and expended
- 11 from the fund, and the sources of receipts and uses of
- 12 expenditures, not less than twenty days prior to the convening
- 13 of each regular session."
- 14 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 15 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 16 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2009.
