A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- The legislature finds that the lucrative jobs 1 SECTION 1. of today are, more and more, found within the diverse fields of 2 science and high technology. Economies that ground themselves 3 in science and high technology have found success, armed with a 4 workforce that is well-educated, benefiting from work products 5 that provide for a better lifestyle, and able to compete on a 6 7 national if not international scale. It is important that first steps be taken by stimulating 8 the interest and achievement of Hawaii's students in this arena, 9 10 and during the 2007 legislative session, various related programs were established and expanded. However, Hawaii lacks 11 an overall, statewide plan to progress in science and high 12 13 technology beyond the schools. Therefore, the purpose of this Act is to establish a task 14 force to develop the Hawaii state science and technology plan. 15 (a) There is established the Hawaii state 16 SECTION 2. science and technology task force within the high technology 17

- 5 (1) Evaluate the effectiveness of past and current science 6 and high technology legislation, including legislation 7 relating to industry development, incentives, 8 oversight, and sustainability;
- 9 (2) Develop the Hawaii state science and technology plan
 10 for the direction of science and high technology in
 11 Hawaii, which shall include:
 - (A) A list of goals established for the science and high technology sector in the state;
 - (B) A plan to reach the established goals; and
 - (C) A timeline for implementation and completion;
 - (3) Assist the legislature in maintaining an overall framework to guide the development of science and high technology in the state by creating guidelines for future science and high technology legislation; and
- 20 (4) Submit recommendations or proposals for science and high technology legislation to meet the goals established in the plan.

- (d) The task force shall select a chairperson by a

 11 majority vote of its members. A majority of the task force

 12 shall constitute quorum to do business. The concurrence of a

 13 majority of all the members to which the task force is entitled

 14 shall be necessary to make any action of the task force valid.
- 16 Hawaii state science and technology plan developed pursuant to
 17 this section, to the legislature no later than twenty days prior
 18 to the convening of the regular session of 2011. The task force
 19 shall also submit to the legislature every five years
 20 thereafter, an updated report that reassesses the plan.
- 21 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general 22 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much

- 1 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2009-2010 and the
- 2 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
- 3 2010-2011 to support the operations of the Hawaii state science
- 4 and technology task force.
- 5 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the high
- 6 technology development corporation for the purposes of this Act.
- 7 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2009.
