A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE HAWAII TOURISM AUTHORITY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. Section 201B-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
2	amended b	y amending subsections (b), (c), (d), and (e) to read	
3	as follows:		
4	"(b)	The authority shall be headed by a policy-making	
5	board of	directors [which] that consists of twelve [public,	
6	<pre>voting] members[, and four ex officio nonvoting members];</pre>		
7	provided	that:	
8	(1)	[Twelve public, voting] The members shall be appointed	
9		by the governor as provided in section 26-34, except	
10		as otherwise provided by law;	
11	(2)	The [twelve public, voting] members shall be composed	
12		of at least one representative each from the city and	
13		county of Honolulu and the counties of Hawaii, Kauai,	
14		and Maui; the remaining [public] members shall be	
15		appointed at-large;	
16	(3)	[Of the twelve public, voting members, three] Three	
17		members shall be appointed by the governor from a list	
18		of three names submitted for each appointment by the	
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president of the senate, and three shall be appointed
by the governor from a list of three names submitted
for each appointment by the speaker of the house of
representatives; provided that if fewer than three
names are submitted for each appointment, the governor
may disregard the list;

- (4) At least six [of the twelve public, voting] members shall have knowledge, experience, and expertise in the area of visitor industry management, marketing, promotion, transportation, retail, entertainment, or visitor attractions, and at least one shall have knowledge, experience, and expertise in the area of Hawaiian cultural practices; provided that no more than three members shall represent, be employed by, or be under contract to any sector of the industry represented on the board;
- (5) The governor shall make appointments to ensure the fulfillment of all requirements; provided that any appointments made after July 1, 2002, shall be made to fulfill the requirements in place when the appointments are made; and

1	[-(6)	The director of business, economic development, and
2		tourism, or a designated representative, shall be an
3		ex officio nonvoting member;
4	(7)	The director of transportation, or a designated
5		representative, shall be an ex officio nonvoting
6		member;
7	(8)	The chairperson of the board of land and natural
8		resources, or a designated representative, shall be an
9		ex officio nonvoting member;
10	(9)	The executive director of the state foundation on
11		culture and the arts, or a designated representative,
12		shall be an ex officio nonvoting member; and
13	(10)]	(6) No person who has served as a member of the board
14		of directors of the Hawaii Visitors and Convention
15		Bureau shall be eligible to sit as a [public, voting]
16		member of the board of directors of the Hawaii tourism
17		authority until at least two years have expired
18		between the person's termination from service on the
19		Hawaii Visitors and Convention Bureau board and the
20		person's appointment to the authority's board of
21		directors.

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- 1 (c) [The public members] Members shall be appointed by the
- 2 governor for terms of four years. Each [public] member shall
- 3 hold office until the member's successor is appointed and
- 4 qualified. Section 26-34 shall be applicable insofar as it
- 5 relates to the number of terms and consecutive number of years a
- 6 member may serve on the board.
- 7 (d) The board shall elect a chairperson from among the
- 8 [voting] members. [The director of business, economic
- 9 development, and tourism or the designated representative shall
- 10 not be chairperson of the board.
- 11 (e) Seven [voting] members shall constitute a quorum and a
- 12 minimum of seven affirmative votes shall be necessary for all
- 13 actions by the authority. The members shall serve without
- 14 compensation, but shall be reimbursed for expenses, including
- 15 traveling expenses, necessary for the performance of their
- 16 duties."
- 17 SECTION 2. Section 201B-13, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 18 amended to read as follows:
- 19 "[+] §201B-13[+] Assistance by state and county
- 20 agencies [-]; advisory group. (a) Any state or county agency
- 21 may render services upon request of the authority.

2	shall inc	lude the director of business, economic development,
3	and touri	sm, director of transportation, chairperson of the
4	board of	land and natural resources, and executive director of
5	the state	foundation on culture and the arts to advise the
6	authority	on matters relating to their respective departments or
7	agency in	the preparation and execution of:
8	(1)	Measures to respond to tourism emergencies pursuant to
9		section 201B-9;
10	(2)	Programs for the management, improvement, and
11		protection of Hawaii's natural environment and other
12		areas frequented by visitors;
13	(3)	Measures to address issues affecting airlines, air
14		routes, and barriers to travel to Hawaii; and
15	(4)	Programs to perpetuate the cultures of Hawaii and
16		engage local communities to sustain and preserve the
17		native Hawaiian culture."
