
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO LANGUAGE ACCESS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Hawaii is a melting
2 pot of diverse nationalities and cultures. Diversity defines
3 Hawaii's residents and makes this State a unique place to live.

4 The legislature also finds that according to the 2000
5 United States Census, over twelve per cent of the State's
6 residents speak English "less than very well." These residents
7 face daily challenges, whether it is struggling to consult with
8 a school counselor about their child's performance at school, or
9 seeking to understand a notice regarding public housing
10 benefits.

11 The legislature further finds that as only one of four
12 states to enact a statewide law on language access, Hawaii is on
13 the leading edge of breaking down language barriers to enable
14 its diverse population, particularly persons who are limited in
15 their English language proficiency, to gain equal access to
16 much-needed government services at no extra charge. Whether the
17 State provides access to its services and programs through an
18 interpreter or translates key documents needed to access its



1 services, residents with limited English proficiency benefit by
2 being able to fully participate in the community as self-
3 sufficient and productive members of the community. Ongoing
4 education and efforts are needed to ensure that language access
5 becomes the "norm" in the provision of government services.

6 The purpose of this Act is to designate an unspecified
7 month as "Language Access Month" to promote awareness of
8 language access for government services and emphasize the
9 importance of and need for language access in Hawaii's diverse
10 society.

11 SECTION 2. Chapter 8, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended
12 by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to
13 read as follows:

14 "§8- Language access month. The month of shall
15 be known and designated as "language access month" to promote
16 awareness of language access for government services and
17 emphasize the importance of and need for language access in
18 Hawaii's diverse society. This month is not and shall not be
19 construed as a state holiday."

20 SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.

21 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2112.
