## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE BUDGET OF THE OFFICE OF HAWAIIAN AFFAIRS.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to appropriate funds
- 2 for the biennial budget of the office of Hawaiian affairs and
- 3 this Act shall be known and may be cited as the "Office of
- 4 Hawaiian Affairs Appropriations Act of 2009."
- 5 SECTION 2. Unless otherwise clear from the context, as
- 6 used in this Act:
- 7 "Program ID" means the unique identifier of the specific
- 8 program, and consists of the abbreviation for the office of
- 9 Hawaiian affairs followed by a designated number for the
- 10 program.
- "Means of financing," or "MOF," means the source from which
- 12 funds are appropriated or authorized, as the case may be, to be
- 13 expended for the programs and projects specified in this Act.
- 14 Letter symbols following appropriations have the following
- 15 meanings:
- 16 A: General Funds
- 17 T: Trust Funds

1 "Position ceiling" means the maximum number of permanent positions authorized for a particular program during a specified 2 3 period or periods, as noted by an asterisk. 4 SECTION 3. The following sums, or so much thereof as may 5 be necessary to accomplish the purposes and programs designated 6 herein, are appropriated or authorized, as the case may be, from 7 the sources of funding specified to the office of Hawaiian 8 affairs for the fiscal biennium beginning July 1, 2009 and 9 ending June 30, 2011. Referral services include 2 3 those relating to education assistance, employment and income 4 security, individual and family care, health needs, housing, 5 legal services, genealogy research, business assistance, and 6 general information; provided further that notwithstanding 7 section 10-17(e), Hawaii Revised Statutes, any funds expended 8 for the purposes of this section shall be in accordance with chapter 103D or 103F, Hawaii Revised Statutes, as appropriate. 9 10 SECTION 6. Provided that of the funds appropriated for beneficiary advocacy (OHA 175), the sum of \$790,433 in general 11 12 funds and \$790,433 in trust funds for fiscal year 2009-2010 and the sum of \$809,334 in general funds and \$809,334 in trust funds 13 for fiscal year 2010-2011 shall provide for educational 14 15 enrichment programs for native Hawaiian children in grades K 16 through 12 throughout the state. Program activities are to be 17 designed to optimize learning for Hawaiian students and are intended to develop a stronger interest in learning, connect 18 learning and education to one's Hawaiian identity, and explore 19 20 possible educational, career, and academic goals the students 21 may not have considered; provided further that notwithstanding 22 section 10-17(e), Hawaii Revised Statutes, any funds expended

- 3 SECTION 7. Provided that of the funds appropriated for
- 4 beneficiary advocacy (OHA 175), the sum of \$643,703 in general
- 5 funds and \$643,703 in trust funds for fiscal year 2009-2010 and
- 6 the sum of \$624,802 in general funds and \$624,802 in trust funds
- 7 for fiscal year 2010-2011 shall provide legal services and legal
- 8 representation to office of Hawaiian affairs beneficiaries for:
- 9 the assertion and defense of quiet title actions; assistance
- 10 with ahupua a and kuleana tenant rights, including rights of
- 11 access and rights to water, land title assistance, including
- 12 review of title and genealogy, preservation of traditional and
- 13 customary practices, protection of culturally significant
- 14 places, and preservation of native Hawaiian land trust
- 15 entitlements; provided further that notwithstanding section 10-
- 16 17(e), Hawaii Revised Statutes, any funds expended for the
- 17 purposes of this section shall be in accordance with chapter
- 18 103D or 103F, Hawaii Revised Statutes, as appropriate.
- 19 SECTION 8. Provided that whenever the need arises, the
- 20 board of trustees of the office of Hawaiian affairs or their
- 21 designee is authorized to transfer sufficient funds and
- 22 positions between programs for operating purposes; provided



- 1 further that these transfers shall not be inconsistent with
- 2 legislative intent; and provided further that a report of these
- 3 fund transfers shall be made to the legislature no later than
- 4 thirty days prior to the convening of the 2010 and 2011 regular
- 5 sessions.
- 6 SECTION 9. If any portion of this Act or its application
- 7 to any person or circumstances is held to be invalid for any
- 8 reason, the remainder of the Act and any provision thereof shall
- 9 not be affected. If any portion of a specific appropriation is
- 10 held to be invalid for any reason, the remaining portion shall
- 11 be independent of the invalid portion and shall be expended to
- 12 fulfill the objective and intent of the appropriation to the
- 13 extent possible.
- 14 SECTION 10. In the event manifest clerical, typographical,
- 15 or other mechanical errors are found in this Act, the board of
- 16 trustees of the office of Hawaiian affairs is hereby authorized
- 17 to correct such errors. All changes made pursuant to this
- 18 section shall be reported to the legislature at its next
- 19 session.
- 20 SECTION 11. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2009.
