A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that almost every school
2	in Hawaii is plagued by traffic congestion that results from
3	poor planning and increased vehicular traffic. It is estimated
4	that as much as twenty to twenty-five per cent of morning
5	traffic consists of parents driving their children to school.
6	Ironically, safety concerns lead parents to drive their children
7	to school, which increases traffic and makes it even less safe
8	for others to walk and bike. Unfortunately, fifty per cent of
9	children who are hit by cars near schools are hit by cars driver
10	by parents of other students.
11	As part of the 2005 Safe, Accountable, Flexible, Efficient
12	Transportation Equity Act: A Legacy for Users, Public Law No.
13	109-59, Hawaii has been awarded \$1,000,000 per year for five
14	years for the Safe Routes to School program. Program funds may
15	be used for both infrastructure-related and behavioral projects
16	designed to reduce traffic, fuel consumption, and air pollution
17	in the vicinity of schools and provide a safe and appealing

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- 1 environment for primary and secondary school children to walk
- 2 and bicycle to school.
- 3 Efficient and effective use of Safe Routes to School
- 4 funding requires planning that includes the full range of
- 5 community stakeholders so that projects have the support of
- 6 parents, students, and schools needed to succeed. Planning also
- 7 needs to deemphasize very expensive engineering changes, like
- 8 additional traffic lights that can consume one-third of the
- 9 annual grant budget. Smaller projects involving more
- 10 stakeholders and more schools are necessary to generate change
- 11 across a broad spectrum of the state. The process must begin
- 12 with assembling basic information about transportation issues
- 13 confronting students, parents, and the community.
- 14 The purpose of this Act is to:
- 15 (1) Enhance traffic safety, especially around Hawaii's
- schools;
- 17 (2) Enable and encourage children to walk and bicycle to
- 18 school; and
- 19 (3) Make bicycling and walking to school a safer and more
- 20 appealing transportation alternative through the
- 21 federal Safe Routes to School program.

1	SECT	ION 2. (a) The director of transportation, through	
2	the Safe	Routes to School coordinator, and in consultation with	
3	the depar	tment of education, department of health, and Hawaii	
4	Associati	on of Independent Schools, shall provide federal Safe	
5	Routes to School program funds for school-based and community-		
6	based workshops and infrastructure and non-infrastructure		
7	projects	that will reduce vehicular traffic and congestion,	
8	encourage	walking and bicycling, and promote health and safety	
9	around Ha	waii's schools. Implementation of the Safe Routes to	
10	School pr	ogram shall take into consideration the need to:	
11	(1)	Create and fill a permanent, full-time position of	
12		Safe Routes to School coordinator within the	
13		department of transportation to provide a central	
14		point of contact for the program;	
15	(2)	Maximize the participation of stakeholder groups in	
16		the community and school officials;	
17	(3)	Train volunteer facilitators for school-based	
18		workshops and community-based projects, including	
19		flexible training schedules;	
20	(4)	Train potential grant requestors and stakeholder	
21		groups in federal and state requirements necessary in	
22		procurement, contracts, design, and construction; and	

1	(5)	Allocate not less than ten per cent and not more than
2		thirty per cent of the apportionment of federal Safe
3		Routes to School program funds for non-infrastructure-
4		related activities or activities to encourage walking
5		and bicycling to school, public awareness campaigns,
6		student sessions on bicycle and pedestrian safety, or
7		other non-infrastructure activities as prescribed
8		under Section 1404 of P.L. 109-59 of the federal Safe,
9		Accountable, Flexible, Efficient Transportation Equity
10		Act.

- (b) Each grant proposal in the Safe Routes to Schoolprogram shall:
- (1) Identify the modes of travel used by students to getto school;
- 15 (2) Determine the number of students using each mode of
 16 travel;
- 17 (3) Survey the parents of each student to gather
 18 information regarding the factors involved in the
 19 choice of transportation mode for the student and,
 20 where the student travels by automobile or bus,
 21 what would need to change for the parent to permit the

1		student to walk or ride a bicycle to school, and	
2	9	obstacles to walking and biking; and	
3	(4)	Identify traffic infrastructure elements in the	
4		immediate vicinity of each school, including multi-	
5		lane roadways, speed limits, and traffic calming	
6		features that, either by their presence or absence,	
7	,	contribute to the use of automobiles as a student's	
8	. 1	mode of travel to school.	
9	SECTI	ON 3. The director of transportation, in	
10	consultati	on with organizations that have received non-	
11	infrastructure and pending infrastructure grants, shall develop a		
12	streamlined process for the federal Safe Routes to School grant		
13	program that meets federal and state requirements, simplifies		
14	the application process, and expedites release of funding after		
15	completion of school-based and community-based projects for		
16	infrastructure and non-infrastructure.		
17	SECTI	ON 4. The director of transportation shall submit to	
18	the legisl	ature a report of the status and progress of the Safe	
19	Routes to	School program, no later than twenty days prior to the	
20	convening	of the regular session of 2010.	
21	SECTI	ON 5. Nothing in this Act shall be construed as	
22	requiring	actions or omissions that would render the State
