WHEREAS, Muslims constitute an ethnically diverse part of Hawaii's cultural fabric, with around 3,000 practicing members;

WHEREAS, Islam is the second largest religion in the world, with over one billion followers spread across every continent, and including members of many nations and many cultures; and

WHEREAS, the Islamic world preserved works of science and philosophy during the Middle Ages when these disciplines were threatened by bigotry and prejudice in other parts of the world; and

WHEREAS, Islamic artists, scientists, and philosophers have a rich history of contribution to world literature and our collective scientific understanding; and

WHEREAS, the Islamic faith incorporates the teachings and texts of both Christianity and Judaism, whose followers are respected and considered "People of the Book"; and

WHEREAS, Islamic doctrine encourages generosity in its adherents, maintaining that those who possess much have a responsibility to care for those in need; and
