HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING STATE AND LOCAL LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS TO ABIDE BY STATE LAWS RELATING TO THE MEDICAL USE OF MARIJUANA.

WHEREAS, the legislative intent of Act 228, Session Laws of 1 2000, was to ensure that seriously ill people are not penalized 2 by the State for the medical use of marijuana; and 3 4 5 WHEREAS, Act 228, which is codified in part IX of chapter 329, Hawaii Revised Statutes, permits qualified patients to use 6 marijuana for strictly medical purposes when the patient's 7 treating physician provides a professional opinion that the 8 benefits of the medical use of marijuana would likely outweigh 9 10 the health risks for the qualifying patient; and 11 WHEREAS, section 329-122, Hawaii Revised Statutes, permits 12 13 qualifying patients and their primary caregivers to jointly possess an amount of marijuana that is not more than is 14 reasonably necessary to assure the uninterrupted availability of 15 marijuana for the purpose of alleviating the symptoms or effects 16 of a qualifying patient's debilitating medical condition, 17 provided that this amount does not exceed three mature marijuana 18 plants, four immature marijuana plants, and one ounce of usable 19 marijuana per each mature plant; and 20 21 WHEREAS, it is often difficult for qualifying patients to 22 23 acquire and cultivate marijuana for medical use; 24 WHEREAS, since the enactment of Act 228, state and local 25 26 law enforcement agencies have authorized and conducted searches 27 of qualifying patients' property and seized supplies of medical 28 marijuana that state law permits qualifying patients to possess 29 and use; now, therefore, 30 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 31 32 Twenty-fifth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session

1 of 2009, the Senate concurring, that state and local law 2 enforcement officers are requested to abide by state laws 3 regarding the medical use of marijuana; and

5 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 6 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, the 7 Director of Public Safety, the state Attorney General, and the 8 police departments of the counties of Oahu, Maui, Kauai, and 9 Hawaii.
