HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING ALL HOSPITAL EMERGENCY ROOMS IN THE STATE TO PROVIDE EMERGENCY CONTRACEPTION ON DEMAND TO VICTIMS OF SEXUAL ASSAULT OR RAPE.

WHEREAS, when a victim of violent crime that results in
physical injury seeks medical attention, the health care system
should do everything possible to respond and administer
medically necessary care; and

6 WHEREAS, sexual assault, or rape, is a crime that is 7 violent, traumatic, and the ultimate, intimate violation in 8 which a woman loses all sense of personal control, decision-9 making, and dignity, and in which she is physically and 10 psychologically ripped apart; and

12 WHEREAS, healers are responsible for providing victims with 13 information regarding procedures being followed to ease pain, 14 information critical to decisions regarding injuries, 15 information regarding the risks of sexually transmitted disease, 16 and honest information about the risks of pregnancy and 17 emergency contraception; and

19 WHEREAS, according to the American College of Obstetricians 20 and Gynecologists, the American Medical Association, and the 21 American College of Emergency Physicians, the accepted standard 22 of care for victims of sexual assault includes the provision of 23 emergency contraception, if desired; and

25 WHEREAS, across the nation, more than four hundred 26 Catholic, nonprofit hospitals dispense emergency contraception 27 to rape victims; and

29 WHEREAS, under Hawaii law, a for-profit corporation would 30 not qualify for a religious employer exemption to the

requirement that employer group medical insurance policies must 1 provide coverage for contraceptive services; and 2 3 WHEREAS, a private nonprofit institution would meet the 4 standard for a religious employer exemption under Hawaii law 5 regarding contraceptives only if: 6 7 The inculcation of religious values is the purpose of 8 (1)the entity; 9 10 The organization primarily employs persons who share (2)11 12 its religious beliefs; 13 It is not staffed by public employees; and 14 (3) 15 (4)The entity qualifies as a nonprofit organization under 16 17 section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code; and 18 WHEREAS, rape victims and victims of sexual assault deserve 19 20 the fullest and best care available according to the standards set by the American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists 21 22 and other professional medical groups; now, therefore, 23 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 24 25 Twenty-fifth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2009, the Senate concurring, in order to assure that victims 26 27 of rape and sexual assault receive the fullest and best care 28 available, urges all hospital emergency rooms in the State to adhere to the accepted standard of care for victims of rape and 29 30 sexual assault, including the administration of emergency contraception without delay and without adding insult to injury 31 by requiring patient transfer to another institution; and 32 33 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all hospitals in the State are 34 urged to ensure that all hospital emergency personnel are 35 properly trained in handling the special needs of rape victims 36 including the education and provision of emergency contraceptive 37 services; and 38 39
