HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF BUSINESS, ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT, AND TOURISM TO ESTABLISH A WORKING GROUP TO INVESTIGATE THE FEASIBILITY OF CREATING A MARKET IN THE TOURISM INDUSTRY FOR RIFLERY, ARCHERY, AND HUNTING ACTIVITIES.

1 2 3 4 5	WHEREAS, the potential for a niche market in the State's tourism industry for riflery, archery, and hunting exists because of the significant interest from Asian visitors, many who come from countries that prohibit these activities; and
5 6 7 8 9	WHEREAS, in Florida, nearly six million adult residents enjoy some form of wildlife associated recreation, bringing in more than \$11,000,000 in revenue to the state; and
10 11 12 13	WHEREAS, the State's public and private riflery ranges, galleries, and private landowners that support and allow seasonal game hunting see the potential of developing and marketing the sport to visitors; and
14 15 16 17 18	WHEREAS, feral boar and other feral animals are hunted to reduce populations capable of destroying native species, agricultural produce, and private property, an activity that can be promoted to hunting enthusiasts; and
19 20 21 22 23	WHEREAS, hunting outfitters and hunting guide services have the ability to grow and expand, increasing the impact of riflery, archery, and hunting on the State's economy; and
24 25 26 27 28 29	WHEREAS, an increase in the number of people paying licensing and user fees, permits, and other related charges and expenses would provide additional revenue to the State, grow a niche tourism industry, and promote the growth of businesses providing services to the sport; now, therefore,



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BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 1 Twenty-fifth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 2 of 2009, the Senate concurring, that the Department of Business, 3 4 Economic Development, and Tourism is requested to convene a working group to research and report on the viability of 5 6 attracting tourists to Hawaii to participate in riflery, archery, and hunting activities; and 7 8 9 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department is requested to investigate and study the feasibility of creating a market in 10 the tourism industry for riflery, archery, and hunting 11 activities by: 12 13 14 (1)Identifying challenges, barriers, and opportunities to promote riflery, archery, and hunting as a niche 15 market in the tourism industry; 16 17 (2) Reviewing existing laws and rules pertaining to 18 19 riflery, archery, and hunting; and 20 Recommending any changes to existing laws and rules to 21 (3) promote riflery, archery, and hunting as a niche 22 market in the tourism industry; and 23 24 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Director of Business, 25 Economic Development, and Tourism, is requested to select 26 fifteen members for the working group, to include 27 representatives from the Department, the Division of Forestry 28 29 and Wildlife, Division of Aquatic Resources, and hunter education program of the Department of Land and Natural 30 Resources, state and county law enforcement agencies, industries 31 related to riflery, archery, and hunting, community 32 organizations, sports enthusiasts and suppliers, and 33 organizations providing related transportation and equipment; 34 35 and 36 37 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism and the Department of Land and 38 Natural Resources are requested to provide any necessary 39 administrative, professional, technical, and clerical support to 40 the working group; and 41 42 43 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Business, 44 Economic Development, and Tourism is requested to present the HCR LRB 09-2927.doc 2 4

1 findings and recommendations of the working group, including any 2 proposed legislation, to the Legislature twenty days prior to 3 the convening of the 2010 Regular Session; and

5 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 6 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Director of 7 Business, Economic Development, and Tourism, the Chairperson of 8 the Board of Land and Natural Resources, and the Administrators 9 of the Division of Forestry and Wildlife, Division of Aquatic 10 Resources, and hunter education program of the Department of 11 Land and Natural Resources.
