HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DISSEMINATION OF INFORMATION TO THE PUBLIC ABOUT THE VETERANS PREFERENCE FOR TENANT SELECTION IN STATE LOW-INCOME HOUSING PROJECTS.

1 WHEREAS, government establishes various preferences for 2 certain groups of its citizens in determining who should receive 3 a government service or be benefitted by a government program; 4 and 5

6 WHEREAS, these preferences often recognize that certain 7 groups of persons have a greater need for the service or 8 program, and can also be used to encourage individuals to 9 participate in certain activities, and reward and recognize 10 these individuals for their actions; and

12 WHEREAS, government should encourage individuals to serve 13 their country by enlisting in the military, reward the service 14 and sacrifices of veterans and their families, and recognize the 15 difficulties of veterans in successfully returning to civilian 16 life; and

18 WHEREAS, providing eligible veterans a housing preference 19 recognizes the service and sacrifices of veterans, and decreases 20 the difficulty of purchasing and providing a home for their 21 families in Hawaii; and

23 WHEREAS, extending or limiting veterans' preference to 24 widows and widowers of deceased veterans or veterans who are 25 totally or partially disabled strengthens the basis for the 26 preference and focuses it on those who have an even greater need 27 for affordable housing and other government programs and 28 services; and

30 WHEREAS, under section 356D-42, Hawaii Revised Statutes, in
 31 the selection of tenants for state low-income housing projects,
