HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THAT FEDERAL FUNDING BE PROVIDED TO THE CENTERS FOR DISEASE CONTROL AND PREVENTION TO ESTABLISH A CHRONIC OBSTRUCTIVE PULMONARY DISEASE PROGRAM.

WHEREAS, chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD) is a 1 progressive disease characterized by a long-lasting obstruction 2 of the airways that occurs with chronic bronchitis, emphysema, 3 4 or both; and 5 WHEREAS, COPD affects as many as ten percent of the world's 6 population of people older than 40 years of age and is the 7 fourth leading cause of death in the United States; and 8 9 WHEREAS, to date, there is no cure for COPD; and 10 11 12 WHEREAS, the federal Division of Adult and Community Health (DACH) is charged with managing programs that provide cross-13 cutting chronic disease and health promotion expertise and 14 support to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's 15 (CDC) National Center for Chronic Disease Prevention and Health 16 Promotion, and the states, communities, and other partners; and 17 18 WHEREAS, DACH also manages several important and high-19 20 profile chronic disease prevention and control programs for specific chronic diseases, and is charged with assessing new and 21 emerging chronic disease issues and launching new programs for 22 the CDC's National Center for Chronic Disease Prevention and 23 Health Promotion: and 24 25 WHEREAS, currently, there is no funded comprehensive 26 national program on COPD with information, research, and a 27 module of surveillance questions at the CDC; and 28 29 WHEREAS, the creation of a funded CDC comprehensive 30 national program including all stakeholders for COPD will enable 31 information on the potentially debilitating disease to be 32



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centralized and coordinated, and lead to better sharing of key 1 information; and 2 3 WHEREAS, more research, funding, and coordinated efforts 4 will lead to better and more effective treatments for COPD; now, 5 therefore. 6 7 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 8 Twenty-fifth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 9 of 2009, the Senate concurring, that appropriate federal funding 10 be provided for the CDC to establish a COPD comprehensive 11 national program (which includes a module of surveillance 12 questions), to provide COPD information and research, and to 13 coordinate efforts toward better and more effective treatments 14 for COPD; and 15 16 17 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
