HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE AUDITOR TO CONDUCT A COMPARATIVE FINANCIAL AND MANAGEMENT AUDIT OF THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH'S COMMUNITY MENTAL HEALTH CENTER AND WAI`ANAE'S INDEPENDENTLY OPERATED COMMUNITY MENTAL HEALTH CENTER.

WHEREAS, the Department of Health seeks to improve the 1 mental health of Hawaii's people by reducing the prevalence of 2 emotional disorders and mental illnesses; and 3 4 5 WHEREAS, services include mental health education, treatment, and rehabilitation through community-based mental 6 health centers and private providers of services; and 7 8 9 WHEREAS, there are nine community health centers in Hawaii that provide mental health services; and 10 11 WHEREAS, of the State's nine community health centers, Hale 12 Na`au Pono, also known as the Wai`anae Coast Community Mental 13 Health Center, is the only private nongovernmental organization; 14 the other eight centers operate under the Department of Health; 15 16 and 17 WHEREAS, the transformation of the mental health services 18 in the State of Hawaii has been of primary concern of everyone 19 associated with such services, garnering a major federal grant 20 over several years for that purpose; and 21 22 23 WHEREAS, the cost and quality of service in the State's mental health system has been a source of major concern and 24 outcry among the people of Hawaii; and 25 26 WHEREAS, Hale Na`au Pono originally operated as part of the 27 28 statewide system of mental health centers daring the mid-1970's, but it eventually separated from the Department of Health as a 29

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1 demonstration model to serve the Wai`anae community as a separate
2 "catchment" area; and

4 WHEREAS, Hale Na`au Pono incorporated in 1986 and opened its 5 doors as a private community-operated center in 1987, and, for the past twenty-two years, it has continued to serve the Wai`anae 6 coast community and has accrued Commission on Accreditation of 7 8 Rehabilitation Facilities accreditation, recognition in its 9 leadership role for quality of service, and acclaim for its cultural and social appropriateness of services and unique 10 11 recovery program called Voyage to Recovery; and

WHEREAS, Hale Na`au Pono has developed a range of services 13 14 far in excess of any state-operated Community Mental Health Center, including a wide range of clinical levels of services, 15 16 housing programs across the community, an International Center for Clubhouse Development-certified alcohol and drug treatment 17 program, smoking cessation program, and numerous other support 18 services to aid in the recovery from serious mental illnesses; 19 20 and

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WHEREAS, there appears to be a lack of parity between salary, benefits, cost reimbursements, staffing qualifications, and other operational requirements between the state-run Community Mental Health Centers and the Wai`anae Community Mental Health Center; and

WHEREAS, it would be appropriate to carry out a comparative study of this twenty-two year old Wai`anae demonstration community mental health center and the state-operated community mental health centers that examines costs, contracts, national accreditations, services provided, quality of services, consumer satisfaction, and other relevant subjects; now, therefore,

36 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Twenty-37 fifth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2009, 38 the Senate concurring, that the Auditor is requested to conduct a 39 financial, program, and management audit of the Department of 40 Health's community based mental health centers and the Wai`anae 41 Coast Community Mental Health Center, Hale Na`au Pono; and 42

43 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Auditor is requested to 44 include in the financial, program, and management audit:

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1 (1) An assessment of all contracts issued to all of the 2 3 community health centers, including Hale Na`au Pono; 4 A cost analysis of operations comparing the state-run 5 (2) centers and Hale Na`au Pono; 6 7 (3) A comparison of salaries and benefits of comparable 8 positions at state-run centers and Hale Na`au Pono; 9 10 A comparison of the accreditation standards met over 11 (4)the past two decades by the state-run centers and Hale 12 Na`au Pono; 13 14 The respective credentialing and certification or (5) 15 licensing of the professional staff employed by state-16 run centers and Hale Na`au Pono; and 17 18 (6) Any other issues the Auditor deems relevant; and 19 20 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Adult Mental Health Division 21 of the Department of Health, the community health centers operated 22 by the Department of Health, Hale Na`au Pono, and other relevant 23 persons or agencies are requested to cooperate with and assist 24 the Auditor and to provide information requested by the Auditor; 25 and 26 27 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Auditor is requested to 28 submit any findings and recommendations, including any proposed 29 legislation, to the Legislature not later than twenty days prior 30 to the convening of the Regular Session of 2010; and 31 32 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 33 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, the Auditor, 34 the Director of Health, and the President and Chairperson of the 35 Executive Committee of Hale Na`au Pono. 36 37 OFFERED BY: 38 39

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
