HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES TO ADOPT, AMEND, OR REPEAL RULES IN ORDER TO RECOGNIZE AND RESPECT THE HAWAIIAN SYSTEM OF HANAI DURING THE LICENSING OF FOSTER PARENTS.

1	WHEREAS, over 50 percent of children in foster care, or
2 3	approximately 1,400 children, are of Hawaiian ancestry; and
4	WHEREAS, only about one-half of the foster children who are
5	of Hawaiian ancestry are placed in foster homes that share their
6 7	Hawaiian culture; and
7 8	WHEREAS, native Hawaiian communities and families have
9	expressed concern that cultural needs are not considered as
10	heavily as they should be in the placement of foster children;

13	WHEREAS, the Hawaiian culture has long embraced the
14 15	traditional system of "hanai" which allows a person other than a child's parent to play a substantial role in the material
15	support and upbringing of the child; and

19	Hawaiian ancestry in a hanai relationship are the children's
