HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

RECOGNIZING EARTH HOUR BY ENCOURAGING THE PEOPLE OF HAWAII TO TURN OFF THEIR LIGHTS FROM 8:30 P.M. TO 9:30 P.M., HAWAII STANDARD TIME, ON MARCH 28, 2009.

WHEREAS, the impact of climate change is an enormous threat to the condition of the planet and health of its inhabitants; and

5 WHEREAS, Earth Hour is based on Eastern Standard Time, when 6 it is evening in Hawaii, and will be observed on March 28, 2009, 7 from 8:30 p.m. to 9:30 p.m., Hawaii Standard Time (HST), by

WHEREAS, in 2008, this monumental unified call for action on climate change resulted in more than 50,000,000 people turning off their lights for Earth Hour; and

WHEREAS, lights were turned off in the Empire State Building, Golden Gate Bridge, Coliseum in Rome, and Sydney Opera House, and Google's home page went dark for the day; and

WHEREAS, hundreds of cities have agreed to participate in Earth Hour 2009, including Los Angeles, Las Vegas, Sydney, and Hong Kong; and

WHEREAS, turning off lights for Earth Hour will:

Symbolically urge the U.S. Administration to lead 1 (1)global efforts to secure a strong new climate change 2 3 treaty; 4 Support global efforts to curb deforestation, the 5 (2)cause of nearly 20 percent of all carbon dioxide 6 emissions worldwide: 7 8 9 (3) Support legislation to establish a cap-and-trade program to lower domestic greenhouse gas emissions and 10 promote the establishment of a low-carbon economy 11 through renewable energy sources and improved energy 12 standards; and 13 14 Encourage the development of a preparedness strategy (4)15 to assess and cope with the impacts of climate change 16 on ecosystems and agriculture in the U.S.; 17 18 19 and 20 WHEREAS, the climate is changing rapidly and its impact on 21 the environment is growing exponentially, thereby profoundly 22 23 affecting current and future generations; now, therefore, 24 25 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Twenty-fifth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 26 of 2009, the Senate concurring, that the Governor, the Mayor of 27 each county, all government entities in Hawaii, and people of 28 Hawaii are encouraged to turn off their lights from 8:30 p.m. to 29 30 9:30 p.m. HST on March 28, 2009, in recognition of Earth Hour. 31
