HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

RECOGNIZING OCTOBER AS DOMESTIC VIOLENCE AWARENESS MONTH.

WHEREAS, home should be a place of warmth, unconditional 1 love, and security, but for some, it has become tainted with 2 violence and fear; and 3 4 WHEREAS, domestic violence is much more than the occasional 5 6 family dispute; and 7 WHEREAS, domestic violence, which includes intimate partner 8 violence, is a pattern of assault or coercive behaviors that may 9 10 include physical injury, psychological abuse, sexual assault, progressive social isolation, stalking, deprivation, 11 intimidation, and threats; and 12 13 WHEREAS, domestic violence also includes socially 14 15 unacceptable behaviors perpetrated by an individual who is, was, or wishes to be involved in an intimate or dating relationship, 16 17 with the intent of establishing control over another person; and 18 WHEREAS, domestic violence is a societal problem that has 19 20 reached epidemic proportions; and 21 WHEREAS, domestic violence is also a serious criminal 22 23 justice and public health problem, resulting in serious and sometimes fatal consequences; and 24 25 WHEREAS, physical and psychological abuse can be so 26 traumatizing that its adverse health effects can persist for 27 28 years after the abuse has ended; and 29 30 WHEREAS, intimate partner violence, regardless of gender, 31 affects families across America in all socioeconomic, racial, 32 and ethnic groups; and

WHEREAS, a coalition of organizations has emerged to 1 confront this crisis directly, including law enforcement 2 agencies, domestic violence awareness groups, health care 3 4 providers, community-based organizations, faith-based organizations, and many other groups, to help in the effort to 5 end domestic violence; and 6 7 WHEREAS, it is important to recognize the compassion and 8 dedication of the individuals involved in this effort, applaud 9 their commitment, and increase public awareness of this 10 11 significant problem; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Twenty-fifth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2009, the Senate concurring, that the Legislature recognizes October as Domestic Violence Awareness Month in the State of Hawaii; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Attorney General,
prosecuting attorney in each county, chief of police of the
police departments in each county, Executive Director of the
Hawaii State Coalition Against Domestic Violence, and Executive
Director of the Domestic Violence Action Center.
