HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

RECOGNIZING THE MONTH OF MAY AS "FOSTER CARE AWARENESS MONTH", A TIME TO EDUCATE THE PUBLIC ABOUT THE VARIOUS COMPONENTS OF FOSTER CARE, INCLUDING FOSTER PARENTS, CHILDREN, AND FAMILIES.

WHEREAS, the foster care system plays an important role in 1 the lives of more than 500,000 children nationwide that are in 2 foster care programs; and 3 4 WHEREAS, on average each day in the state 1,700 Hawaii 5 children live in foster homes; and 6 7 WHEREAS, there are many difficulties faced by children in 8 9 the foster care system that require a commitment to improve 10 foster care programs; and 11 WHEREAS, many children in the foster care system have spent 12 multiple years in foster care programs, experiencing an unstable 13 home life due to frequent moves from one foster home to another; 14 15 and 16 WHEREAS, approximately 50 percent of foster care children 17 have been placed in foster care programs for longer than one 18 19 year; and 20 21 WHEREAS, nearly a quarter of foster care children have been placed in foster care programs for at least three years; and 22 23 WHEREAS, children in foster care programs for longer 24 periods of time often experience worse outcomes than children in 25 foster care programs for shorter periods of time; and 26 27 28 WHEREAS, children in foster care programs are more likely than the general population to become teen parents, to rely on 29

public assistance as adults, to become homeless, and to 1 experience mental health disorders at a higher rate; and 2 3 WHEREAS, repeated studies have shown that a child's very 4 5 early years are crucial for brain development, making it extremely important to find suitable permanent homes for 6 7 children during this critical period; and 8 9 WHEREAS, many children are eligible for adoption every year with fewer than half of the children in foster care programs 10 11 actually getting adopted; and 12 WHEREAS, not only is a stable home critical to a child's 13 development, but every child deserves to be raised by a loving 14 family; now, therefore, 15 16 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 17 Twenty-fifth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 18 of 2009, the Senate concurring, that the Legislature hereby 19 recognizes the month of May as "Foster Care Awareness Month", a 20 time to educate the public about the various components of 21 22 foster care, including foster parents, children, and families; and 23 24 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that continuing to improve the 25 foster care system in Hawaii will remain a top priority for the 26 Legislature; and 27 28 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 29 30 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, Director of Human Services, Director of Kokua Ohana, Executive Director 31 of Hawaii Youth Services Network, and President of Foster Family 32 Programs of Hawaii. 33 34 35 36
