HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH TO INVESTIGATE HAZARDS POSED BY POLYSTYRENE FOOD CONTAINERS AND TO ESTABLISH STANDARDS FOR BIODEGRADABLE PLASTIC FOOD CONTAINERS AND GROCERY BAGS.

1 WHEREAS, many types of everyday household products and materials are manufactured from various types of plastics; and 2 3 WHEREAS, styrene is a clear colorless liquid that is 4 derived from petroleum and natural gas by-products, but which 5 also occurs naturally; and 6 7 WHEREAS, styrene is used in the manufacture of many types 8 9 of plastic materials, including food containers and packaging, computer parts, and automobile components; and 10 11 WHEREAS, styrene can enter packaged foods by migration from 12 polystyrene food containers and packaging materials, and test 13 14 results are unclear as to whether the amount of styrene leaching increases when foods are heated in polystyrene containers; and 15 16 WHEREAS, human data from tests are insufficient to conclude 17 that styrene, when ingested, is toxic to normal human growth and 18 19 development; and 20 WHEREAS, grocery bags manufactured from low density 21 polyethylene do not biodegrade naturally in landfills and when 22 improperly disposed may enter the environment as litter and pose 23 a hazard to marine wildlife; and 24 25 WHEREAS, improperly disposed polystyrene that enters the 26 27 environment as litter can create health hazards for marine wildlife, including entanglement and ingestion; now, therefore, 28 29 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 30 Twenty-fifth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 31

of 2009, the Senate concurring, that the Department of Health is 1 requested to adopt rules requiring polystyrene food containers 2 sold in the State to display a label that warns of the potential 3 dangers of heating food in the container; and 4 5 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Health is 6 requested to conduct a study, based on available research and 7 data, that assesses the safety of polystyrene food containers; 8 9 and 10 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Health is 11 requested to form a task force to establish minimum statewide 12 standards for biodegradability for plastic grocery bags and food 13 14 containers; and 15 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Health is 16 17 requested to submit a report of its findings and recommendations to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the 18 convening of the Regular Session of 2010; and 19 20 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a certified copy of this 21 22 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Director of Health. 23 24 25 OFFERED BY:
