HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE OFFICE OF THE GOVERNOR, THE SENATE, AND THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES TO STUDY ISSUES RELATING TO THE CONTINUATION OF STATE GOVERNMENT DURING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, maintaining continuity of state government and 1 fulfilling government duties and responsibilities during 2 emergency situations is of growing concern to many states; and 3 4 5 WHEREAS, many state legislatures and executive offices have reviewed their laws and enacted legislation or established 6 procedures to provide clear instruction for lines of succession 7 8 if members of the legislature or other elected officials are unable to perform their duties, for the relocation of state or 9 10 local government, if necessary, and other issues relating to the continuation of government and fulfilling of state government 11 duties and responsibilities during an emergency; and 12 13 14 WHEREAS, although the various government agencies in the State of Hawaii have previously addressed continuity of 15 government issues, a new review would be prudent to determine 16 whether statutory amendments or procedural changes are necessary 17 to improve or expedite the process relating to the continuity of 18 government in an emergency; and 19 20 21 WHEREAS, a review of state law and government procedures relating to continuity of government in an emergency, including 22 any constitutional issues, and the subsequent codification into 23 a single chapter of Hawaii Revised Statutes would assist present 24 and future government officials and employees in preparing for 25 an emergency situation and executing recovery measures in a 26 timely manner; now, therefore, 27 28 29 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Twenty-fifth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 30

31 of 2009, the Senate concurring, that the Governor is requested

to conduct a review of constitutional and state law, practices 1 and procedures, and other relevant information relating to 2 fulfilling the duties, functions, and responsibilities of the 3 Offices of the Governor and Lieutenant Governor and executive 4 departments in an emergency and submit to the Legislature no 5 later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular 6 Session of 2010 a report of findings and recommendations, 7 including any proposed legislation, on issues of the Office of 8 the Governor, the Office of the Lieutenant Governor, and state 9 executive departments and agencies that relate to the continuity 10 of constitutional government in an emergency. 11 12 The Governor is requested to include in the report findings 13 14 and recommendations relating to: 15 Possible sites identified for relocation of executive 16 (1)and legislative operations; 17 18 (2) Criteria and procedures used to determine suitability 19 for relocating the seat of state government; 20 21 Liability issues if appropriate action is not taken to 22 (3) ensure continued performance of essential functions of 23 state government, including the safety of state 24 employees, visitors, and the public; 25 26 (4)An assessment of existing operational capabilities, 27 based upon functions, staffing, and system 28 29 capabilities; 30 31 .
