## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE NA ALA HELE ADVISORY COUNCIL TO CONVENE A SERIES OF DISCUSSIONS ON THE SAFE USE OF HUNTING DOGS ON TRAILS THAT CROSS PUBLIC HUNTING AREAS.

WHEREAS, certain public hiking trails in the State of Hawaii traverse across areas designated by the Department of Land and Natural Resources (DLNR) as hunting areas, where hunters, hikers, and outdoor enthusiasts come into contact with one another; and

WHEREAS, both hikers and hunters may be accompanied by dogs on these hiking trails; and

WHEREAS, the placement of public hiking trails in hunting areas makes it easier for hunting dogs to move without restraint on trails that are also used by hikers with pet dogs; and

WHEREAS, hunters and their hunting dogs play an important role in managing the feral pig populations on state lands, further preserving our watershed areas and preventing damage on private property; and

WHEREAS, non-hunters are required by DLNR to keep their pet dogs on leashes at all times while on public trails; and

WHEREAS, hunters are required by DLNR to keep their dogs "under restrictive control during transportation while in transit at all times, to and from hunting areas within the forest reserve"; and

1 WHEREAS, the officers of DLNR's Division of Conservation and Resources Enforcement that are responsible for enforcing 2 rules regarding hunting dogs lack the resources for enforcement 3 across vast areas of state lands and are unable to respond 4 5 quickly to concerns; and 7 WHEREAS, the Na Ala Hele Advisory Council, made up of members who represent all interested constituencies, including 8 9 hikers and hunters, was established to provide a public forum at which all trail issues could be considered; and 10 11 12 WHEREAS, concerns over safety on public hiking trails that travel across hunting areas have been raised by residents, 13 hikers and outdoor enthusiasts that utilize these areas; now, 14 15 therefore, 16 17 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Twenty-fifth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 18 19 of 2009, the Senate concurring, that the Na Ala Hele Advisory 20 Council convene a series of discussions on the safe use of hunting dogs on trails that cross public hunting areas; and 21 22 23 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group should include in the dialogue representatives from: 24 25 (1) Honolulu Police Department; 26 27 28 (2) Citizens for Safe Hiking; 29 **30** (3) Oahu Pig Hunters Association; 31 32 (4) Hawaiian Humane Society; 33 34 (5) Hawaii Hunting Association; 35 **36** (6) Hawaii Rifle Association; 37 (7) Hawaiian Trail and Mountain Club; and 38 39 40 (8) Other interested stakeholder groups; and 41

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Na Ala Hele Advisory Council submit a report on the outcomes of the discussions to
