## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REOUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH TO STUDY THE FEASIBILITY OF THE FUTURE IMPLEMENTATION OF AN AMBULANCE DISPATCH CENTER ON THE WEST SIDE OF KAUAI, BASED IN KALAHEO.

WHEREAS, the protection and preservation of the health of Hawaii's people is a matter of compelling state interest; and

WHEREAS, emergency ambulance services, available twentyfour-hours a day, can help reduce medical emergency deaths, injuries, and permanent long-term disability and are a key component of the State's comprehensive emergency medical services system; and

WHEREAS, a timely response and immediate transport to an acute care treatment facility is key to preventing irreversible damage; and

WHEREAS, the Island of Kauai has five ambulance units that are located in:

- (1) Princeville, serving from north of Anahola and the entire north shore;
- (2) Kapaa, serving just north of Anahola until north of the Wailua Golf course;
- (3) Lihue, serving from north of Wailua Golf course to Halfway Bridge;
- (4) Koloa, serving from Halfway Bridge to Brydswood; and
- (5) Waimea, serving Brydswood and the entire west side of Kauai:
