HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE GOVERNOR ESTABLISH A TASK FORCE TO CONSIDER THE ESTABLISHMENT OF TOWNSHIPS OR OTHER POLITICAL SUBDIVISIONS TO ASSIST IN THE PROVISION OF INFRASTRUCTURE IN PRIVATE SUBDIVISIONS.

WHEREAS, in the 1950's and 1960's, the County of Hawaii 1 2 (County), in an attempt to raise its real property tax base, allowed the development of large land areas into private 3 subdivisions containing marketable parcels of various sizes 4 5 without the benefit of infrastructure including roads and highways, water, sewer, and drainage improvements; and 6 7 8 WHEREAS, today, these private subdivisions are nonconforming in relation to present county standard subdivision 9 10 requirements, thereby jeopardizing the welfare, health, and safety of the residents of those private subdivisions; and 11 12 13 WHEREAS, approximately forty-nine of these private subdivisions, containing approximately forty-two per cent of the 14 County's population residing in these nonconforming private 15 subdivisions, remain in existence; and 16 17 WHEREAS, in the past, various unsuccessful self-help 18 attempts have been tried by residents of these private 19 subdivisions to raise their standard of living to equal other 20 residents of the County, including attempts to make direct 21 payments for needed improvements, special county assistance, and 22 the consideration of improvement district financing; and 23 24 WHEREAS, in an, to date, unsuccessful attempt to improve 25 26 their roads and highways, a number of the residents of the 27 private Hawaiian Paradise Subdivision have attempted to 28 establish a system of assessments and collection of road 29 maintenance fees, but lacked a key ingredient of success, the co-signature of the County on a promissory note from a private 30 funding source; and 31



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1 WHEREAS, the residents of Hawaiian Paradise Subdivision now 2 desire to attempt to meet their goal of the provision of 3 subdivision improvements by establishing a township or other 4 political subdivision, comprising of the Hawaiian Paradise 5 Subdivision; now, therefore, 6 7 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 8 9 Twenty-fifth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2009, the Senate concurring, in an attempt to assist all 10 residents of private subdivisions, the Governor is requested to 11 establish a task force to consider various methods of assisting 12 the residents of private subdivisions on the island of Hawaii to 13 provide for basic infrastructure needs of the residents of the 14 private subdivisions; and 15 16 17 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Governor is requested to appoint the following officials or their designated 18 representatives comprise the task force: 19 20 The Director of Finance, as chairperson of the task 21 (1)22 force; 23 (2)The Director of Taxation; 24 25 (3) The Attorney General; 26 27 28 (4)The Comptroller; 29 30 (5)The Mayor of the County of Hawaii; 31 The Corporation Counsel of the County of Hawaii; (6) 32 33 The Director of Finance of the County of Hawaii; (7)34 35 The Planning Director of the County of Hawaii; and (8) 36 37 (9) The Director of Public Works; and 38 39 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force is requested to 40 consider the following: 41 42 The practicality and advisability of establishing a 43 (1)political subdivision of the State to assist residents 44 HCR LRB 09-1935.doc
