A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	PART I
2	SECTION 1. (a) There is established a medical cannabis
3	task force that shall be placed within the department of public
4	safety for administrative purposes. The purpose of the medical
5	cannabis task force shall be to review issues relating to the
6	medical marijuana program. The director of public safety shall
7	be responsible for administering the work of the medical
8	cannabis task force. The medical cannabis task force shall:
9	(1) Examine current state statutes, state administrative
10	rules, and all county policies and procedures relating
11	to the medical marijuana program;
12	(2) Examine all issues and obstacles that qualifying
13	patients have encountered with the medical marijuana
14	program;
15	(3) Examine all issue and obstacles that state and county
16	law enforcement agencies have encountered with the
17	medical marijuana program;

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1	(4)	compare and concrast nawari's medical marijuana
2		program with all other state medical marijuana
3		programs; and
4	(5)	Address other issues and perform any other function
5		necessary as the task force deems appropriate,
6		relating to the medical marijuana program.
7	(b)	The medical cannabis task force shall consist of
8	eleven me	mbers as follows:
9	(1)	The director of public safety or the director's
10		designee;
11	(2)	The director of health or the director's designee;
12	(3)	The director of transportation or the director's
13		designee;
14	(4)	The attorney general or the attorney general's
15		designee;
16	(5)	The president of the Hawaii State Bar Association or
17		the president's designee;
18	(6)	The president of the Drug Policy Forum of Hawaii or
19		the president's designee;
20	(7)	One patient advocate to be appointed by the governor;

1	(8)	A prescribing physician as designated by the Hawaii
2		Medical Board established under chapter 453, Hawaii
3		Revised Statutes;
4	(9)	A Hawaii-licensed physician who specializes in pain
5		control and has issued a medical marijuana
6		recommendation;
7	(10)	The president of West Oahu Hope for a Cure Foundation
8		or the president's designee; and
9	(11)	The director of Americans for Safe Access - Honolulu
10		Chapter, or the director's designee.
11	(c)	The members of the task force shall select a
12	chairpers	on from among its members, who, in conjunction with the
13	director	of public safety, shall establish task force
14	procedure	s, including the meeting schedule, voting procedures,
15	and membe	r duties.
16	The	members of the task force shall serve without
17	compensat	ion, but shall be reimbursed for necessary expenses,
18	including	travel expenses, incurred in the performance of their
19	official	duties.
20	(d)	The director of public safety shall submit a report of
21	the medic	al cannabis task force's findings and recommendations,

including any proposed legislation and rules, to the legislature

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- 1 no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the regular
- 2 session of 2010.
- 3 (e) The medical cannabis task force shall cease to exist
- 4 on June 30, 2010.
- 5 PART II
- 6 SECTION 2. The legislature finds that Salvia divinorum,
- 7 otherwise known as "diviner's sage" or "magic mint," is not
- 8 regulated in Hawaii. The legislature further notes that several
- 9 countries, such as Australia, Belgium, Denmark, Estonia,
- 10 Finland, Italy, Japan, Spain, and Sweden have passed regulatory
- 11 laws on Salvia divinorum or its primary psychoactive
- 12 constituent, salvinorin A. In the United States, California,
- 13 Delaware, Florida, Illinois, Iowa, Kansas, Louisiana, Maine,
- 14 Michigan, Mississippi, Missouri, New Jersey, North Dakota, Ohio,
- 15 Oklahoma, Pennsylvania, South Carolina, Tennessee, and Virginia
- 16 regulate Salvia divinorum, with approaches ranging from
- 17 classification as a Schedule I controlled substance to placing
- 18 restrictions on its sale. The legislature finds that possible
- 19 regulation of Salvia divinorum and its primary psychoactive
- 20 constituent, salvinorin A, is worthy of formal examination by
- 21 the State.

1	SECTI	ON 3. (a) There is established a Salvia divinorum
2	task force	within the department of public safety for
3	administra	tive purposes. The purpose of the Salvia divinorum
4	task force	e shall be to review the effects of Salvia divinorum
5	and its pr	rimary psychoactive constituent, salvinorin A. The
6	director o	of public safety shall be responsible for administering
7	the work o	of the salvia divinorum task force. The Salvia
8	divinorum	task force shall:
9	(1)	Research the uses and effects of Salvia divinorum and
10		salvinorin A on adults and minors;
11	(2)	Research all other states' legislation relating to
12		salvia divinorum and salvinorin A;
13	(3)	Recommend appropriate legislation resulting from its
14		findings to address the sale and use of Salvia
15		divinorum and salvinorin A in Hawaii; and
16	(4)	Address other issues and perform any other function
17		necessary as the task force deems appropriate,
18		relating to Salvia divinorum or salvinorin A.
19	(b)	The salvia divinorum task force shall consist of the
20	following	members:
21	(1)	The director of public safety or the director's

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designee;

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1	(2) The director of health or the director's designee;
2	(3) The administrative director of the judiciary or the
3	administrative director's designee;
4	(4) The attorney general or the attorney general's
5	designee;
6	(5) The president of the Hawaii State Bar Association or
7	the president's designee; and
8	(6) The president of the Drug Policy Forum of Hawaii or
9	the president's designee.
10	(c) The members of the task force shall select a
11	chairperson from among its members, who, in conjunction with the
12	director of public safety, shall establish task force
13	procedures, including the meeting schedule, voting procedures,
14	and member duties.
15	The members of the task force shall serve without
16	compensation, but shall be reimbursed for necessary expenses,
17	including travel expenses, incurred in the performance of their
18	official duties.
19	(d) The director of public safety shall submit a report of

the Salvia divinorum task force's findings and recommendations,

including any proposed legislation or rules, to the legislature

- 3 (e) The Salvia divinorum task force shall cease to exist
