A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Act 125, Session			
2	Laws of Hawaii 2008, aligned Hawaii's teacher licensure			
3	requirements with the criteria for highly qualified teachers as			
4	prescribed by the No Child Left Behind Act.			
5	The purpose of this Act is to amend those provisions			
6	related to emergency hires by clarifying that:			
7	(1) No individual may be employed on an emergency basis			
8	for more than three consecutive years; and			
9	(2) Unlicensed teachers employed on an emergency basis			
10	after June 30, 1997, but prior to July 1, 2008, may be			
11	employed on an emergency basis for no more than four			
12	consecutive years.			
13	SECTION 2. Section 302A-804, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is			
14	amended to read as follows:			
15	"§302A-804 Powers and duties of the department. The			
16	department shall retain all of its rights and powers except for			

the authority provided to the board under this subpart. The

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1 department's powers and duties under this subpart shall be 2 limited to: 3 (1) Hiring, except in emergency situations as described in 4 this chapter, licensed teachers to teach in their 5 fields of licensing; Reporting data annually to the board about the supply 6 (2) 7 of, and demand for, teachers, including the 8 identification of shortage areas, out-of-field 9 teaching assignments, numbers of teachers teaching **10** out-of-field, numbers and types of courses and classes 11 taught by out-of-field teachers, and numbers and types 12 of students taught by out-of-field teachers; 13 On an emergency and case-by-case basis, hiring (3) 14 unlicensed individuals; provided that: 15 A list of the names, work sites, teaching (A) 16 assignments, and progress toward licensing of 17 these individuals shall be reported to the board 18 and any changes shall be updated on a monthly 19 basis by the department; 20 There are no properly licensed teachers for the (B) 21 specific assignments for which the individuals

are being hired;

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1		(C)	No individual may be employed by the department
2			on an emergency basis for more than three
3			consecutive years. During this time, the
4			individual shall demonstrate active pursuit of
5			licensing in each year of employment; and
6		(D)	Notwithstanding subparagraph (3)(C), unlicensed
7			individuals who have been hired on an emergency
8			basis after June 30, 1997, but prior to July 1,
9			2008, [shall attain licensure no later than four
10			years from the date of their employment;] may be
11			employed on an emergency basis for no more than
12			four consecutive years;
13	(4)	Subm	itting an annual report to the board documenting:
14		(A)	The number of emergency hires by subject matter
15			areas and by schools;
16		(B)	The reasons and duration of employment for the
17			emergency hiring enumerated in subparagraph (A);
18		(C)	Individual progress toward licensing; and
19		(D)	The department's efforts to address the shortages
20			described in subparagraph (A); and
21	(5)	Prov	iding any other information requested by the board
22		that	is pertinent to its powers and duties."
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- 1 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 2 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 3 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

Education; Teachers; Emergency Hires

Description:

Clarifies that no teacher may be employed as an emergency hire for more than three consecutive years; unlicensed teachers employed as emergency hires after June 30, 1997, but prior to July 1, 2008, may be employed on an emergency basis for no more than four consecutive years. (SD1)
