## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SCHOOL MEALS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The intent of this Act is to modify the manner
- 2 by which prices for school meals, currently including lunch and
- 3 breakfast, are determined. The costs of food, fuel, and labor
- 4 increase each year and the department of education requires a
- 5 way to adjust the price of school meals in order to maintain
- 6 that the cost to the students shall be no less than one-half of
- 7 the cost of preparing the meals. Currently, the Hawaii Revised
- 8 Statutes provide for the method of determining school lunch
- 9 prices and the breakfast price is set by administrative rule.
- 10 The purpose of this Act is to authorize the same method for
- 11 pricing both lunch and breakfast.
- 12 SECTION 2. Section 302A-101, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 13 amended by adding a new definition to be appropriately inserted
- 14 and to read as follows:
- ""School meals" means breakfast and lunch prepared and
- 16 served by a school cafeteria."

1 SECTION 3. Section 302A-404, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended to read as follows: 3 "[+]§302A-404[+] School [lunches.] meals. School 4 [lunches] meals shall be made available under the school [lunch] 5 meals program in every school where the students are required to 6 eat [lunch] meals at school." 7 SECTION 4. Section 302A-405, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 8 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows: 9 "(a) The price for [the] school [lunch] meals shall be set **10** by the department to ensure that moneys received from the sale 11 of the [lunches may] meals shall be not less than [up-to] one-12 half of the cost of preparing the [school lunch] meals. **13** [price] prices for [the] school [lunch shall] meals may be 14 adjusted annually based on the [average cost of preparing the 15 school lunch over the three years preceding any increase; 16 previous year's costs rounded to the nearest five cents; 17 provided that the department by rule shall provide a lower rate 18 or free [lunches] meals to children based on their economic 19 need." 20 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed

and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
