A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO GLOBAL WARMING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. (a) The global warming task force is					
2	established within the department of health, for administrative					
3	purposes	rposes only, to:				
4	(1)	Asse	ess the current and potential impacts of global			
5		warm	ning and climate change trends on the citizens,			
6		natu	ral resources, and the economy of the State,			
7		incl	uding impacts on:			
8		(A)	The visitor industry;			
9		(B)	Intrastate and interstate air and sea			
10			transportation of cargo and persons;			
11		(C)	Existing buildings and the public utilities			
12			infrastructure;			
13		(D)	The health of the people of the State; and			
14		(E)	Native plants, animals, and ecosystems;			
15	(2)	Asse	ess the potential impacts of rising ocean levels as			
16		a re	sult of climate change on the citizens, natural			

1		resources, and the economy of the State, including
2		impacts on:
3		(A) The visitor industry;
4		(B) Shoreline erosion;
5		(C) Intrastate and interstate air and sea
6		transportation of cargo and persons;
7		(D) Existing buildings and the public utilities
8		infrastructure;
9		(E) The health of the people of the State; and
10		(F) Native plants, animals, and ecosystems;
11	(3)	Estimate the costs to the State of the adverse effects
12		associated with climate change and rising sea levels;
13		and
14	(4)	Make recommendations to the legislature and the
15		governor on measures that would address or mitigate
16		the near- and long-term effects of climate change,
17		including:
18		(A) Preventing shoreline erosion;
19		(B) Preserving the visitor industry;
20		(C) Relocating the transportation infrastructure,
21		such as airports and shipping terminals;

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1		(D)	Implementing restrictions on construction in	
2			affected areas;	
3		(E)	Improving or hardening the public utilities	
4			infrastructure;	
5		(F)	Preparing for health emergencies; and	
6		(G)	Maintaining the health and resilience of native	
7			species and ecosystems.	
8	(b)	The	global warming task force shall consist of	
9	twenty-nin	ne members, as follows:		
10	(1)	The	governor or governor's designee;	
11	(2)	Two	members of the house of representatives, to be	
12		appo	inted by the speaker of the house of	
13		repr	esentatives;	
14	(3)	Two	members of the senate, to be appointed by the	
15		pres	ident of the senate;	
16	(4)	The	directors, chairpersons of the boards, or their	
17		desi	gnees of the following state departments:	
18		(A)	Department of health;	
19		(B)	Department of business, economic development, and	
20			tourism;	
21		(C)	Department of transportation;	
22		(D)	Department of agriculture; and	
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1		(E) Department of land and natural resources;
2	(5)	The adjutant general or the adjutant general's
3		designee;
4	(6)	The chairperson of the public utilities commission or
5		the chairperson's designee;
6	(7)	One member from each county to be appointed by the
7		mayor of each county;
8	(8)	One member from the University of Hawaii with
9		expertise in geophysics or climatology, appointed by
10		the governor;
11	(9)	One member from the University of Hawaii with
12		expertise in environmental engineering, appointed by
13		the governor;
14	(10)	One member from the Hawaii tourism authority;
15	(11)	One member from the Waikiki Improvement Association;
16	(12)	One member from each branch of the United States armed
17		services and the Coast Guard;
18	(13)	One member from the United States Army Corps of
19		Engineers; and
20	(14)	Three members selected to represent the interests of
21		affected ocean user groups such as watermen, fishers,
22		and surfers, to be appointed by the governor.

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- 1 Members of the task force shall serve without compensation,
- 2 be reimbursed for expenses necessary for the performance of
- 3 their duties, including travel expenses, and be exempt from the
- 4 requirements of section 26-34, Hawaii Revised Statutes.
- 5 (c) The task force shall:
- (1) Select a chairperson, collect information, research
 reports and expert opinions, and conduct hearings
- 8 throughout the State to fulfill the purpose of this
- 9 Act;
- 10 (2) Submit a preliminary report of its findings and
- 11 recommendations, including any proposed legislation to
- the legislature no later than twenty days prior to the
- convening of the regular session of 2010; and
- 14 (3) Submit a final report of its findings and
- recommendations, including any proposed legislation to
- the legislature no later than twenty days prior to the
- 17 convening of the regular session of 2011.
- 18 (d) The department of health shall provide any necessary
- 19 administrative, professional, technical, and clerical support
- 20 required by the task force.
- 21 (e) The task force shall cease to exist on June 30, 2011.

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- 1 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the tourism
- 2 special fund the sum of \$100,000 or so much thereof as may be
- 3 necessary for fiscal year 2009-2010 and the same sum or so much
- 4 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2010-2011 for the
- 5 purposes of this Act.
- 6 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 7 of health for the purposes of this Act.
- 8 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2070.
